

Get discounted or free travel on public transport.

If you have an eligible concession card, you may be able to **travel for free or a discounted rate** on ACT public transport. This includes travel on public buses and light rail.

Who can get it

You can travel for free, all the time, if you:

- are age 70 or over and have a Seniors Card
- are a child under the age of 6, not attending school
- have a Veteran Gold Card marked TPI or EDA or are their companion
- have a visual impairment
- have an approved Student Transport Program concession card
- are a companion travelling with a Companion Card holder

You can travel for free on weekends, public holidays and between 9am and 4:30pm or after 6pm on weekdays, if you have one of the following:

- Health Care Card
- Pensioner Concession Card
- Veteran Gold Card
- ACT or Interstate Seniors Card
- ACT Services Access Card issued by Companion House

How to get it

You need a MyWay card, or a pre-paid ticket, to travel on public transport in Canberra. You can get a MyWay card from a MyWay agent. Many newsagents and post offices are MyWay agents.

To get discounted or free travel:

1. Go to a MyWay agent and ask to purchase a concession MyWay card.
2. Show your eligible concession card to the person when you buy your MyWay card. The person will apply the concession to your MyWay card.
3. Tap on and tap off using your MyWay card each time you travel. Your free or discounted fare will automatically apply.

Make sure you have credit on your MyWay card and carry your concession card when you travel. You may be asked to show it to prove your concession status.

If your concession card expires and you get a new one, you need to show your concession card again at a MyWay agent. The person will reapply your concession status with a new expiry date so that you can continue to get discounted or free travel.
