Canberra's new transport network which will bring more services to the region

The ACT Government is fast tracking local infrastructure and maintenance projects to protect jobs and support local business.

In the Woden and Weston Creek region, over 30 projects have been fast tracked. These works include improvements to public school facilities, road safety enhancements, health service facility and venue upgrades.


Travel safe during Covid-19

Better bus connections

Woden, Weston Creek and Molonglo Valley residents now have access to more direct bus routes, more frequent services and other improvements across the bus network.

The changes address community feedback and include:

- → 692 extra services each weekday across CBR (up 17.5%)
- → Rapid 10 (Molonglo to City) runs more frequently, every 15 minutes at peak times
- → new frequent route 59 (Woden to Forrest, Barton and Russell) every 15 minutes
- → Rapid 4 and Rapid 5 takes the most direct route from Woden to the City
- → better timings and connections for routes 70/71 (Woden to Tuggeranong) through Kambah and Weston Creek
- → new route 59 (Woden to Forrest, Barton and Russell) every 15 minutes
- → local buses every 30 minutes all day.



An easier trip to school



Changes are also in place for school bus routes in the region, with services increased and more aligned with bell times. Changes include:

- → more Rapid 6 services at busy times between Narrabundah College and Woden
- → a new bus stop on Bielski Street for the future school in Molonglo
- → new route 59 to stop closer to Telopea Park School
- → route 73 will provide a direct service from bus stops near Melrose High School on Athlon Drive to Tuggeranong suburbs.

at the North Weston Park & Ride

Construction on the expansion of the North Weston Park & Ride location will soon get underway. Use of this Park & Ride is expected to grow as the residential area expands.

46 car spaces will be added to enable more Canberrans to use the facility to access Rapid services. Construction is expected to be completed later this year.



Support for CIT Campus - Woden

A recent survey has found more than 85 per cent of respondents are in favour of a mixed-use CIT campus and public transport interchange for the heart of Woden.

Construction on the CIT Woden Campus is due to begin in 2021.

Over the last six months, Tidbinbilla Nature Reserve have worked with wildlife sanctuaries and other institutions to safely care for and return the Reserve's koalas, platypus, northern corroboree frogs and brush-tailed rock wallabies.

Tidbinbilla are currently working to return the remaining brush-tailed rock-wallabies from Mt Rothwell, Victoria. The animals were evacuated after the Orroral Valley Fire threatened their home in January.
