Light rail is coming


With work starting on the raising of London Circuit to enable the construction of the next stage of light rail, commuters should be aware of changing traffic conditions, including:

- Some existing car parking spaces will be required for the establishment of three construction compounds.
- Traffic changes on Vernon Circle and at Parkes Way/Coranderrk Street.
- London Circuit will be closed between Edinburgh and Constitution Avenues for around two years.
- Arterial roads leading to the city will be busier during peak hours.

The project will create a level intersection between London Circuit and Commonwealth Avenue, enabling the next stage of light rail.

Supporting the switch to **electric vehicles**

As zero emission vehicles become cheaper and easier to buy, the ACT Government is supporting Canberrans to make the switch.

If you're eligible, you can take advantage of free stamp duty and two years of free registration. You can also apply for a zero interest loan of up to \$15,000 through the Sustainable Household Scheme to purchase an electric vehicle or install a vehicle charger in your home.

The ACT Zero Emissions Vehicle Strategy maps out the plans to make it cheaper and easier for Canberrans to own an electric vehicle in the ACT.

ACT to go all-electric by 2045

As part of the ACT's net zero emission by 2045 target, fossil fuel gas will be phased out over the next two decades.

For most households, this will be a gradual transition. The best time to switch to electric heating or cooking in your home is when your current appliances reach the end of their life.

However, for those ready to upgrade now, there are government supports and incentives available including:

- the Sustainable Household Scheme,
- Home Energy Support Program, and
- Business Water and Energy Program.

If your gas appliance is reaching end of life, it might be time to choose a more efficient electric alternative.

Walk in for free health care

Whether you have a bump, minor burn, or the common cold, the Weston Creek Walk-in Centre offers a free and accessible alternative to other health care services.

The ACT Government service – available to anyone aged two and over – is staffed by experienced nurses who can treat a wide range of non-life-threatening injuries and illnesses.

The Woden School now has its very own Woolworths, providing students with hands-on experience in handling money and customer service.

While not open to the public, the mini-supermarket includes real groceries, uniforms and cash registers to help students develop their confidence and social skills.

The supermarket is the second of its kind in the ACT, offering an educational tool and employment pathway for students.
