

Canberra's newest Park & Ride is coming soon to Wanniassa. Work has started on the new facility which will be ready for Tuggeranong commuters in the next few months.

The new Park & Ride will make it easier to combine walking, cycling and vehicle use with rapid public transport. It will feature 60 parking spaces, 16 bike racks, two new bus stops with large shelters and improved path connections. The bus stops are located on the high frequency Blue Rapid route with regular weekday services travelling to Tuggeranong, Woden, the City and Belconnen.

A FUTURE CENTRE FOR **LEARNING** IN CHISHOLM



NEW AUTHORITY TO RENEW OUR CITY CENTRE



Canberra's new City Renewal Authority starts operating next month. It will focus on breathing new life into the city centre and Dickson.

The new authority will support development of public spaces and buildings around Northbourne Avenue and will create West Basin's new lakeside precinct. The authority will take the same successful precinct based approach as Brisbane's Southbank and Perth's Elizabeth Quay. It will have a board of directors and expertise in design, engineering, sustainability, community building and administration.

ACT SES crews have responded to more than 2,500 calls for assistance since July 2016. We thank all our SES volunteers for the vital assistance they provide the community throughout the year.



KAMBAH VILLAGE COURTYARD UPGRADE

The central courtyard at the Kambah Village shops is changing, with upgrade works now underway.

Walls will be removed, the old raised timber deck will be replaced with paving and there'll be new outdoor furniture, landscaping, bike racks and water station. Completion is expected soon.

ISABELLA POND IMPROVEMENTS

Work is now underway to upgrade Isabella Pond as part of a suite of improvement works.

In April both Upper Stranger and Isabella Ponds were drained allowing more than 3.8 tonnes of carp, a pest fish species to be

Work has now begun to construct two new wetlands at Isabella Pond and the widening of Isabella Weir. These are the first of up to 25 infrastructure projects that will improve water quality in the region and downstream in the Murrumbidgee River system. Due for completion by mid-2018.
