## GET ON BOARD LIGHT RAIL IS COMING




The first light rail vehicle has arrived in Canberra.

Light rail vehicles will be seen on stage 1 of Canberra's light rail network between Gungahlin and Canberra's CBD later this year.

Construction of the light rail terminals on Hibberson Street has started and testing of the vehicles has already begun.

Each air conditioned vehicle will be able to carry more than 200 passengers and Wi-Fi will be available on board.

## NEW GUNGAHLIN PRIMARY SCHOOL

In 2019 a new primary school will open in Taylor ready to welcome new students for term one.

The school will have a preschool as well as a primary school for 600 students from Kindergarten to Year 6.

The new school, located on the corner of Sutherland Crescent and Horse Park Drive will hold a resource centre and out-of-hours school care facilities.

It will cater for music, science, technology, engineering, arts and maths.

## TERRITORY-WIDE ROLLOUT OF GREEN BINS




Good news for all Canberrans with green waste collections to be fully rolled out across the Territory by around mid-2019.


Residents in Gungahlin, Inner North, Inner South, Woden, and the Molonglo Valley, will be invited to register for their green bin early next year. Green waste collections are already in place in Weston Creek and Tuggeranong. Belconnen collections start later this year.

A one-off fee of \$50 will be required to register for the program. Eligible concession card holders are exempt from payment.
