Bulky waste Collections coming first to Gungahlin

Gungahlin residents will be able to make a booking for bulky waste collection from July.

The new service will provide a convenient and accessible way to dispose of unwanted large and bulky household items.

Gungahlin households will be able to book one collection per year of up to two cubic metres for items including damaged furniture and worn-out household appliances.

Canberra Hospital expansion underway

Preparation works have begun at the Canberra Hospital for a new state-of-the-art emergency, surgical and critical healthcare facility, as part of the SPIRE Project.

High-tech cancer ward opens



A completely revamped ward for haematology and cancer patients has opened at Canberra Hospital.

The ward's design was informed by suggestions from patients, their families and staff. It features a dining room for patients, families and carers as well as day beds where families and carers can stay overnight.

Bigger emergency department for the northside

Works to expand the Calvary Public Hospital Bruce emergency department are nearly complete.

Eight additional beds are now open in the Short Stay Unit, including four equipped for the treatment of children.

Another 14 treatment spaces for a 'fast track' service, and an expanded triage and reception area will open soon.

Several Gungahlin cafes have signed up to Green Caffeen, a free 'swap-and-go' coffee cup scheme.

Canberra's light rail network is being extended to Woden.

The next stage will add 1.7km of track along the western side of London Circuit and onto Commonwealth Avenue, finishing at Commonwealth Park.

This will then continue onwards to connect Gungahlin to Woden.
