### Message from the Chief Minister

The Canberra Hospital Expansion Project is progressing well and will include a new Emergency Department, and new intensive care facilities including four paediatric ICU beds, 22 operating theatres and 156 inpatient beds.

The ACT is also continuing our transition to a low-emissions future by increasing capacity in our Sustainable Household Scheme. Over 9000 Canberrans have used the zero-interest loan program to make sustainable home upgrades like switching from gas to electric heating and installing solar and battery systems.

### Light rail and bus services

Leave the traffic behind. It takes just **24 minutes** to get from the City to Gungahlin Town Centre on the light rail. Services operate **every five to six minutes** during peak periods.

Rapid bus services run **every 15 minutes** and local bus services run **every 30 minutes** during peak periods on weekdays. You can also travel off peak to avoid the rush and for a cheaper fare.

There is also the R8 Rapid service to get you from Gungahlin to Belconnen.





#### **Park and Ride**

Take advantage of three Park and Ride facilities in Gungahlin and pay for lunch, not parking.

Park and connect to a bus or light rail service at these Park and Ride facilities:

- EPIC
- Gungahlin
- Well Station.





### Cycling and walking

Work out before your workday. Cycling or walking are great ways to get exercise and save on money and emissions. Ride part of the way and take your bike using bus bike racks, bike cages or on board light rail.

Scenic cycle routes connect Gungahlin with the rest of Canberra:

- C1 (Gungahlin to City)
- C7 (Gungahlin to Belconnen)
- C9 (Gungahlin to Airport).

Alternatively, use an e-scooter. They are a convenient and environmentally friendly way to travel short distances or connect with public transport. More than 3000 trips are taken every day on shared e-scooters, now available in all regions.

**Did you know** there were more than 3.1 million light rail passenger boardings last year?









## Sustainable Household Scheme to receive a \$50 million boost

The ACT Government has invested an additional \$50 million in the Sustainable Household Scheme to continue helping Canberrans transition to a more environmentally sustainable future.

The Scheme provides zero-interest loans to eligible ACT residents and community groups to help upgrade their homes or facilities, or to utilise renewable energy products. To date, more than 9000 energy-efficient upgrades to ACT households have been completed under the Scheme.

So far, 331 Gungahlin homeowners have taken the step to transition their home from gas to all-electric by applying for a loan for electric heating and cooling systems.

# Work progresses on **Gungahlin's new** schools

Work continues on two new public high schools for Gungahlin, in Kenny and Taylor.

Both schools will provide high-quality general and specialist learning environments, incorporating indoor and outdoor learning areas, as well as integrated spaces to support students with specialised needs.

Existing schools are also receiving upgrades. Automatic sliding doors installed at Gold Creek School senior site will improve access, while a new shade shelter at Ngunnawal Primary School has enhanced an outdoor learning and play space for students and staff.





# Franklin dog park design soon to be released

Did you have your say on the proposed new off-leash dog park in Franklin?

A design will soon be released following feedback from the community. The new Franklin dog park will feature irrigated grass, deciduous trees, an agility play area, accessible loop path and car parking. ## Four lanes now open on Gundaroo Drive

Four lanes have opened on Gundaroo Drive between Ginninderra and Baldwin Drives. New traffic lights are operating at the Dumas Street intersection.

Construction is expected to be completed later in 2023.

This project is jointly funded by the ACT and Australian Governments.


