Free health care at ACT Walk-in Centres

Canberra's Walk-in Centres are a great option when you have an injury or illness that is not life-threatening.

Walk-in Centres can assess and treat anyone from one year of age and all services are free of charge. You don't need an appointment, referral or Medicare card – simply walk in.

There are five Walk-in Centres in convenient locations across Canberra, so you won't need to travel far. You'll find them in Tuggeranong, Weston, Dickson, Belconnen and Gungahlin.

All centres are open between 7.30am and 10pm every day of the year. ACT Walk-in Centres are part of the national network of Medicare Urgent Care Clinics.





Compare and save on energy bills

Shopping around can save you up to \$700 per year on your energy bills.

Construction begins on new Acton Emergency Services Station

Construction is underway on the new Emergency Services Station, located between Clunies Ross Street and Parkes Way in Acton.

The new station will house ACT Fire and Rescue and ACT Ambulance services, ensuring people in the region have access to even better emergency services and fast response times.

It will also provide a safe, modern facility to support first responders' work and wellbeing.

Construction is due to finish by the end of the year, with services operating from the new station from mid-2025.
