CREATING VIBRANT AND USABLE SPACES IN CANBERRA'S CBD



As our city grows and develops, nowhere is more important to plan for than the heart of our city.

A number of initiatives are currently underway across central Canberra to create a vibrant city centre including:

- revitalising the city through the delivery of pop-up events in partnership with the private sector
- > the upgrade of the ACT Law Courts in City West
- proposed construction of construction of Point Park, the first stage of the West Basin Boardwalk and signalised intersections on Commonwealth Avenue
- > a feasibility study for a new city stadium
- upgrades to our cultural facilities including The Street Theatre and The Canberra Theatre

- > the upgrade of Constitution Avenue which will provide significant public transport, walking, cycling and landscape improvements for the community
- > improvements to lighting and footpaths in Haig and Braddon Parks
- > continued development of the city and gateway urban renewal strategy
- > funding allocated to concept designs for the upgrade of Parkes Way
- the development of options for constructing a new aquatic centre in the city.

A number of urban renewal initiatives will also take place during construction of the light rail project which is now underway.

The hop on, hop off service will provide a convenient link to key city hubs such as the city bus station, Canberra Centre, Braddon precinct, Northbourne Avenue, the Australian National University and New Acton precinct.

The City Loop will allow people to also connect with high frequency Red and Blue Rapid services and buses to the Parliamentary Triangle.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF MINISTER, ANDREW BARR














FIND-A-TRADIE IN CANBERRA




TAX REFORMS CREATE BOOST FOR SMALL BUSINESS AND HOUSING AFFORDABILITY

The 2016/17 ACT Budget provides support for Canberra businesses by abolishing insurance tax and making further cuts to Stamp Duty, which will improve housing affordability in the ACT.

The payroll tax threshold has also been lifted to \$2 million. This change means that any Canberra business that generates less than \$2 million per year will be exempt from payroll tax.

Tax reforms also include an effort to ensure people pay their fair share of tax. This reform will see specialist investigators working within the ACT Revenue Office to identify tax evaders in Canberra. The initiative is projected to recoup \$27 million over four years.



IMPROVED DENTAL WAIT TIMES ARE WORTH SMILING ABOUT

Canberra's wait times for restorative dental treatment and dentures have halved in recent years, and kids no longer have to wait at all.

ACT community health centres offer dental programs and can triage for emergency dental care. Please note co-payments may apply.

Restorative dental care involves the diagnosis and treatment of dental disease, including examination, diagnosis, x-rays, fillings, extractions and root canal therapy.

FLORIADE 2016: WHERE FLOWERS BLOOM AND CULTURE BLOSSOMS

Featuring over a million bulbs and annuals, Floriade 2016 will showcase garden design, innovation and top horticultural trends.

Floriade will also host NightFest - five nights of an illuminated evening garden landscape bustling with night markets,

entertainment, roving performers and spectacular lighting designs.

Floriade is held in Commonwealth Park, Canberra and runs from 17 September to 16 October 2016, with NightFest featuring from 28 September to 2 October 2016.







GREEN BINS FOR CANBERRA

Canberra households will be able to opt-in to a new green bin service to dispose of garden waste.

After a 12 month pilot starting early 2017, a city-wide rollout will follow soon after.

Weston Creek and Kambah have been chosen for the pilot. This region covers a good sample size of households and will give the government an understanding of the trucks and infrastructure needed to deliver the service, the regularity required for pickups, and the impact a city-wide rollout would have on existing waste facilities.

'Green bins' will help to divert some of the 5,000 tonnes of garden waste that is currently going to landfill each year.

EXPANDED OUTPATIENTS DEPARTMENT IMPROVES WAITING TIMES

With more than 5.500 appointments every month, one of Canberra Hospital's busiest departments has been refurbished and is now taking patients.

The new Central Outpatients Department now has four new consultation rooms and two reception and waiting areas. The \$1.1 million refurbishment increases consultation capacity by 15 percent, improving waiting times for specialists in the ACT.



TAKE ME OUT TO THE BALL GAME

The Narrabundah Ballpark, Canberra's premier baseball facility and home of the Canberra Cavalry, will receive a \$4.5 million upgrade.

The upgrade will realign the playfield, refurbish the grandstand and improve public amenities, public access and car parking.

Following a \$1.4 million upgrade to the field of play in 2010, the stage two upgrades will further modernise the facility and improve the experience for baseball fans.

Community engagement will occur over the coming months, with construction to commence once the design has been completed.

BETTER DIGITAL SYSTEMS FOR CANBERRA SCHOOLS ____





A new digital school administration system that will benefit parents and carers is set to come online over the next three years.

Benefits include:

- > Fewer paper forms being sent home with children.
- > Permission slips, consent forms and payments submitted online.
- > Online access to academic reports.
- > Faster absence notifications to parents and carers sent directly to personal devices.
- > Streamlining of the enrolment process – with key information provided only once.

The system builds on the successful digital services already available in Canberra Public Schools including high speed internet and Google Apps for Education.

The 2016-17 ACT Budget outlines \$55 million in new initiatives to improve our schools and state-ofthe-art facilities, and strengthen the capacity of schools to support students and their families.

SMART BINS BETTER TO FOR ENVIRONMENT

Solar-powered, self-compacting rubbish bins are currently being trialled in Wright, Campbell and Eastlake Parade on the Kingston Foreshore.

The 'Bigbelly' bins hold four times more than regular bins and provide real-time information to waste collectors on how full they are.

This helps reduce rubbish overflow, unnecessary bin collections and related carbon emissions.

The trial will be evaluated by the ACT Waste Feasibility Study.
