In addition to the SPIRE Centre, The Canberra Hospital will add another four Intensive Care beds and 12 beds for inpatient services in medicine, surgery and aged care.

The Centenary Hospital for Women and Children will expand to support women and young people seeking maternity services and other specialist care.

Site works on the SPIRE Centre will start this year and is expected to be completed by 2023-2024.




Find savings with the Assistance website

There's something for everyone including table tennis, giant jenga, deckchairs to relax, a stage, meeting rooms, nature play space and charging stations for your devices.


