

# CIT Campus – Woden Construction Look Ahead

To March 2022



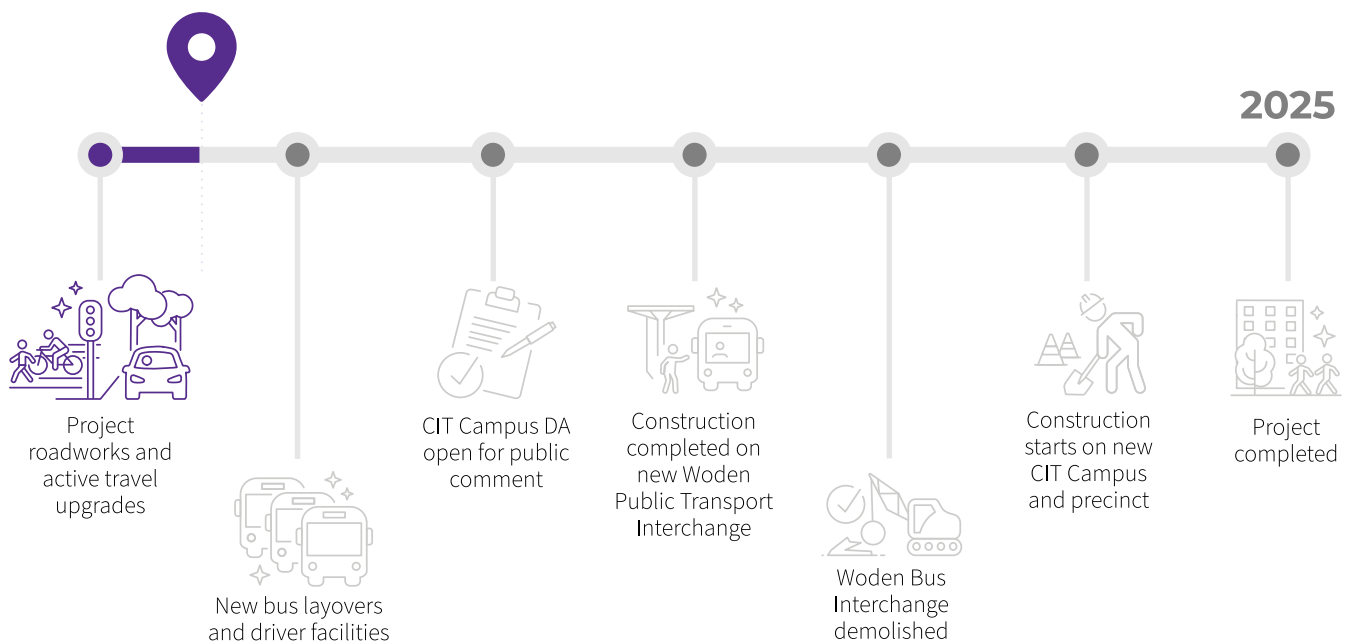

A new town centre precinct is coming to Woden. It will bring state of the art learning facilities, a safer, light rail ready public transport interchange, improved active travel and more green spaces on Woden's eastern side.

Construction in the Woden Town Centre is increasing. This construction look ahead provides a summary of expected activity in the work zones to March 2022.



## Progress so far



## In the Construction Zone

The construction focus to end of March is to complete safer traffic signals and pedestrian crossings along with necessary underground utility works to make the whole project possible. The work on Callam Street is about ensuring that gas, electrical, water and telecommunications services are in place for your new public transport interchange.

Over the next few weeks, it's all hands on deck at Easty Street to get this road re-opened to cars. Following this work, you can expect to see more activity on Launceston Street in March.

Pedestrians please take care and be sure to follow signage. When crossing Callam Street at the Bowes Street lights – be aware of the buses and interchange on the Town Centre side.





### Launceston Street

New markings on the road make it clear that there are now designated BUS ONLY areas of Launceston Street. This is to ensure private cars do not turn into Callam Street.

A temporary bus only area on Launceston Street will be introduced to allow for important utilities works. A safer turn from Launceston Street into Bowes Street will also be installed.

### Matilda Street

For safety reasons, Matilda Street is temporarily closed to private vehicles. Buses and delivery and emergency services will continue to use Matilda Street.

Entry and exit to the Matilda Street public carpark is now on Bowes Street. The Hellenic Club carpark is also accessed via Bowes Street.

There is no pedestrian or cycle access across Callam Street at Matilda Street.

### Bowes Street

A reminder to road users in this area that traffic can only travel in one direction past Grand Central Towers. Please follow the signage.

Note that there is not access to Callam Street from Bowes Street.

Please look out for buses driving both directions on Bowes Street.

### Easty Street reopening March

The final stages of utilities work (gas, stormwater, telecommunications, electrical) is taking place throughout February.

Throughout March, work will continue on upgrades to make the area safer for pedestrians and cyclists. This will include a zebra crossing near the Woden Early Childcare Centre.

The Easty / Launceston Street intersection near Canberra College will have new traffic signals and a safer crossing for students and the community.

### Callam Street

Callam Street is closed to private vehicles to make way for the new public transport interchange. The construction team is working on underground utilities in this area and on ensuring the new interchange can be future-proofed for light rail and longer-term growth.

### Car Parking

The carparks behind Callam Offices, off Easty Street are still accessible via Launceston Street or Wilbow Street.

Pick up / drop off parking spaces remain available on Bowes Street opposite Abode Hotel and outside Grand Central Towers.

### Changes at the bus interchange

Due to construction activity, there are platform changes at the bus interchange. Please check signs and visit the [Transport Canberra website](#) for details.
