Canberra Hospital Expansion continues

Since construction commenced on the main structure in early 2022, the transformation at the Canberra Hospital Expansion Project site has been huge.

- 52,000m³ of soil excavated

 equivalent to 21 Olympic swimming pools
- 49,000m²: total building floor area
 equal to 251 tennis courts
- 1383m² the gross floor area of the 22 new operating theatres – equivalent to 350 king-size beds
- 556 windows, 155,000 bricks and 7500 façade panels
- three trucks have delivered 16 rolls (over 5km) of 400mm² high-voltage cable to power the all-electric building
- about 500 jobs created over the life of the project.

The project is scheduled for completion in 2024.

Sixty schools will benefit from upgrades this financial year. Improvements include new shade sails, inclusive upgrades, bike shelters and enhanced building facilities.

Rethink your routine this year

Light rail to Woden is coming, and there's no better time to think about how and when you travel into the city.

Construction is already underway on the raising of London Circuit and you can minimise disruption by keeping the car at home and walking, cycling or taking public transport.

Rapid bus services connect to all regions in Canberra. A new bus timetable is now in place and several changes have been made across the network, including to school services.

Bike rails and cages are located at many public transport stops and stations. You can take your bike on light rail or use the racks on the front of buses. E-scooters are also perfect for shorter trips or connecting to bus services.

Major investment in ACT roads

More than \$150 million will be invested to repair and preserve Canberra's roads over the next four years.

The ACT Government manages more than 3200km of sealed ACT roads, and this increased investment will see resurfacing of the network increase by 268,000m² a year.

The 2022–23 program is already underway in central Canberra. Arterial road resealing is complete on sections of Parkes Way, including the Glenloch Interchange. Municipal roads in Turner, Griffith and Campbell will also be resealed.
