The Canberra Hospital Expansion Project is progressing well and will include a new Emergency Department, and new intensive care facilities including four paediatric ICU beds, 22 operating theatres and 156 inpatient beds.

The ACT is also continuing our transition to a low-emissions future by increasing capacity in our Sustainable Household Scheme. Over 9000 Canberrans have used the zero-interest loan program to make sustainable home upgrades like switching from gas to electric heating and installing solar and battery systems.

Bus services

Rapid bus services run every 15 minutes and local bus services run every 30 minutes during peak periods on weekdays.

You can also travel off peak to avoid the rush and for a cheaper fare.

There are two Rapid services to get you from Tuggeranong to the City, Woden and Belconnen:

- R4 (Tuggeranong to the City and Belconnen)
- R5 (Lanyon to the City).



Park and Ride

Take advantage of six Park and Ride facilities throughout Tuggeranong and pay for lunch, not parking.

Park and connect onto a bus service at:

- Calwell shops
- Chisholm shops
- · Kambah Centre
- Kambah Village
- Mawson Oval
- Tuggeranong Interchange
- · Wanniassa.

Cycling and walking

Work out before your workday. Cycling and walking are great ways to get exercise and save on both money and emissions. Ride part of the way using one of the Park and Pedal facilities, or take your bike using bus bike racks or bike cages at major stops.

Scenic cycle routes connect Tuggeranong to the rest of Canberra:

- C4 (Tuggeranong to City via Woden)
- C5 (Tuggeranong to Belconnen, or City via Lake Burley Griffin)

Alternatively, use an e-scooter. They are a convenient and environmentally friendly way to travel short distances or connect with public transport.









Sustainable Household Scheme to receive a \$50 million boost

The ACT Government has invested an additional \$50 million in the Sustainable Household Scheme to continue helping Canberrans transition to a more environmentally sustainable future.

The Scheme provides zero-interest loans to eligible ACT residents and community groups to help upgrade homes or facilities, or to utilise renewable energy products. To date, more than 9000 energy-efficient upgrades to ACT households have been completed under the Scheme.

Tuggeranong homeowners have applied for the most solar system loans in the ACT, with 1919 applications received.


Canberra Arena brings ice sports to Greenway

Canberra's new ice sports facility will be named Canberra Arena. Set to be built on Rowland Rees Crescent in Greenway, it is expected to open in 2025.

The new facility will feature two international-standard ice sheets for figure skating, broomball, speed skating and ice hockey, as well as dedicated curling sheets – the first of their kind in Australia.

There will be capacity for 3600 spectators, along with an advanced indoor rock-climbing facility catering to all three Olympic disciplines: lead, speed and bouldering.

Environmentally sustainable features will be incorporated into the arena's design, including solar panels and the provision of LED sports lighting.





Restoration work planned for **Lanyon Homestead**

The heritage-listed Lanyon Homestead will undergo upgrades as part of a significant investment in Canberra's heritage and arts facilities.

The former shearer's sleeping quarters at Lanyon Homestead will be fully restored and reused as artist studios, with the property's beautiful setting at the foot of the Brindabella Ranges sure to inspire artists and visitors alike.

Lanyon Homestead is a highly significant place in Canberra's history, within a diverse cultural landscape. The site is listed on the ACT Heritage Register for its rich Aboriginal, historic and natural values.

A design for the off-leash dog park in Lanyon Valley will soon be released. Incorporating community feedback, the design includes separate play areas for small and large dogs, additional car parking spaces including accessible parking, and an accessible path.


