DECISION ON YOUR ACCESS APPLICATION

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (FOI Act), received by Canberra Health Services (the Directorate) on **Tuesday 9 December 2025**.

You have sought access to the following government information:

'Any report or review by Russell Bayliss into industrial matters in the cardiology department, specifically regarding claims made about Sched 2.2 (a)(ii) FOI Act 2016 from June 1, 2025 until November 1, 2025.

Any ministerial briefings from 2025 regarding the above industrial matter.

Any correspondence from Russell Bayliss to any CHS executives, including but not limited to Janet Zagari, about the above industrial matter.

Any correspondence, including emails and messages, regarding a media request sent Monday, December 4. from the Canberra Times with the subject line:

- Right of reply: Cardiologist allegations

Any correspondence, including emails and messages, regarding a media request sent Monday, December 1 from the Canberra Times with the subject line: media request: Bayliss/cardiology

Any correspondence from Canberra Health Services Clinical Director Shakeeb Basi-Yaseen to doctors from September 1 until December 12 regarding the return of Sched 2.2 (a)(ii) FOI Act 2016

Sched 2.2 (a)(ii) FOI Act 2016 to work at Canberra Hospital as cardiologists.'

Authority

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Chief Executive Officer of the Directorate under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the Act. The Directorate was required to provide a decision on your access application by **Friday 23 January 2026**.

On **Thursday 22 January 2026**, the Directorate wrote to you advising that some information identified as relevant to your request may be of concern to a third party and therefore undertook consultation with the relevant third party. Under section 38 of the FOI Act, a period of 15 working days was required to allow for the consultation process to be undertaken, which subsequently extended the due date to provide a response to your request by **Monday 16 February 2026**.

Searches and material considered

Thorough searches of records in the Directorate relevant to your request were undertaken and I have identified 49 documents holding the information within scope of your access application. These are outlined in the schedule of documents included at Attachment A to this decision letter.

In reaching my access decision, I have taken the following into account:

- your access application dated 9 December 2025;
- the documents containing the information that fall within the scope of your access application;
- the FOI Act;
- the views of relevant third parties;
- the *Human Rights Act 2004*; and
- the *Information Privacy Act 2014*.

Decision on access

My decision is:

- to refuse access to one document at reference 1 with the status “Refuse Release” in the schedule as the information is contrary to the public interest information and has been redacted in full under section 35(1)(c) of the FOI Act; and
- to grant partial access to 48 documents at references 2-49 with the status “Partial Release” in the schedule under section 50 of the FOI Act to copies of the documents with deletions applied to information that is contrary to the public interest.

My access decisions are detailed further in the following statement of reasons and the documents released to you are provided as Attachment B to this letter.

Refuse Access

I have decided to refuse access to one document at reference 1 after deliberations were taken under the public interest test set out in section 17 of the Act and redactions were applied where I decided, on balance, the information is contrary to the public interest to disclose.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(iii) inform the community of the government's operations, including the policies, guidelines and codes of conduct followed by the government in its dealings with members of the community,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(iv) ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(v) allow or assist inquiry into possible deficiencies in the conduct or administration of an agency or public official,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(viii) reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision

Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, Schedule 2.2 (a)(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*;
- Schedule 2, Schedule 2.2 (a)(v) impede the administration of justice for a person;
- Schedule 2, 2.2 (a)(xv) prejudice the management function of an agency or the conduct of industrial relations by an agency; and

- Schedule 2, 2.2 (b) the information — (v) is about unsubstantiated allegations of misconduct or unlawful, negligent or improper conduct and disclosure of the information could prejudice the fair treatment of an individual.

I have given significant consideration to the factors favouring disclosure and I believe the factors favouring non-disclosure outweighed these as the information could reasonably be expected to have a detrimental effect for not only the agency but also to relevant individuals. The release of information regarding the review of unsubstantiated allegations may impede the management function and the conduct of industrial relations by the agency. Interviews for these matters are conducted on a confidential basis, and if released, could reasonably be expected to have a chilling effect on the engagement and participation from staff members.

Employee relations is an area that relies on the ability for all to be able to provide honest input of a situation without fear of reprisal. I consider personal statements made by all members involved in these matters are personal information and could be detrimental to the resolution of a workplace matter regarding unsubstantiated allegations. Therefore, I determined the information identified is contrary to the public interest and I have decided not to disclose this information.

Partial Access

Information identified that is considered contrary to the public interest under Schedule 1 of the FOI Act.

- Redactions have been applied to information contained within the documents at references 2 and 3 under Schedule 1.2 *Information subject to legal professional privilege* - information that would be privileged from production or admission into evidence in a legal proceeding on the ground of legal professional privilege.
- Redactions have been applied to information contained within the documents at reference 6 under Schedule 1.4 *Sensitive information* - information the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of sensitive information about any individual (including a deceased person).
- Redactions have been applied to information contained within the documents at references 8 and 23 under Schedule 1.9 *Identities of people making disclosures* –
- (1) Information that would, or could reasonably be expected to, disclose the identity of a person who has made—
 - (a) a public interest disclosure under the Public Interest Disclosure Act 2012; or
 - (b) a mandatory or voluntary report under the Children and Young People Act 2008; or
 - (c) a confidential report under the Children and Young People Act 2008, section 876.
- (2) Information that would, or could reasonably be expected to, disclose the identity of a person who gives information, produces a document or answers a question in relation to an investigation of a public interest disclosure under the Public Interest Disclosure Act 2012.
- Redactions have been applied to information contained within the documents at references 3-5, 7 and 32-33 under Schedule 1.14 *Law enforcement or public safety information* (1) Information the disclosure of which would or could reasonably be expected to— (e) prejudice a person's fair trial or the impartial adjudication of a matter before a court or tribunal.

Information identified that is considered contrary to the public interest under Schedule 2 of the FOI Act.

Deliberations were taken under the public interest test set out in section 17 of the Act and redactions were applied where I decided, on balance, the information is contrary to the public interest to disclose.

Public Interest Factors Favouring Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(i) promote open discussion of public affairs and enhance the government's accountability,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(ii) contribute to positive and informed debate on important issues or matters of public interest,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(iii) inform the community of the government's operations, including the policies, guidelines and codes of conduct followed by the government in its dealings with members of the community,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(iv) ensure effective oversight of expenditure of public funds,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(v) allow or assist inquiry into possible deficiencies in the conduct or administration of an agency or public official,
- Schedule 2, 2.1 (a)(viii) reveal the reason for a government decision and any background or contextual information that informed the decision

Public Interest Factors Favouring Non-Disclosure

The following factors were considered relevant in favour of the non-disclosure of the documents:

- Schedule 2, Schedule 2.2 (a)(ii) prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy or any other right under the *Human Rights Act 2004*;
- Schedule 2, Schedule 2.2 (a)(v) impede the administration of justice for a person;
- Schedule 2, 2.2 (a)(xv) prejudice the management function of an agency or the conduct of industrial relations by an agency; and
- Schedule 2, 2.2 (b) the information — (v) is about unsubstantiated allegations of misconduct or unlawful, negligent or improper conduct and disclosure of the information could prejudice the fair treatment of an individual.

Documents at references 2-49 are partially comprised of information that may prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy.

Documents at references 3, 6, 8-11, 13-16, 18-19, 21, 23, 25-28, 31 and 34 are partially comprised of information that may impede the administration of justice for a person.

Documents at references 3-11, 13-16, 18-19, 21, 23, 25-26, 28 and 30-34 are partially comprised of information that could divulge information that may impede the management function or the conduct of industrial relations by an agency.

Documents at references 2-3, 6, 8-16, 18-19, 21, 23, 25-28, 31 and 34 are partially comprised of information that is about unsubstantiated allegations of misconduct, or unlawful, negligent or improper conduct and disclosure of the information could prejudice the fair treatment of an individual.

Documents at references 2 and 35 contains redactions to information that is out the scope of your access application.

I have considered the factors favouring disclosure and I believe the factors favouring non-disclosure outweighed these as the information could reasonably be expected to have a detrimental impact. As I outlined earlier in the letter, the release of this documentation and communications could be expected to prejudice the protection of individual's personal privacy and could also prejudice the management function of an agency and the conduct of industrial relations by the agency.

I believe this type of documentation must be kept confidential before, during and after the process to help ensure the fair treatment of employees, maintain a cohesive work environment and help to develop and maintain employee confidence in the process. Therefore, I have decided that the public interest would not be advanced by providing the information.
