#### ON WODEN'S XX


Footpath upgrades around Woden town centre are now complete.

### NEW WETLAND IN HOLDER

New wetlands are being established in Holder, between Dixon Drive and Cotter Road.

The finished wetlands will cover 5600 square metres and, when full will contain approximately 2.4 million litres of water—about the same as an Olympic swimming pool.

Water will be diverted from existing stormwater pipes and help reduce the amount of harmful pollutants entering Canberra's waterways.

#### TERRITORY-WIDE ROLLOUT OF GREEN BINS

Good news for all Canberrans with green waste collections to be fully rolled out across the Territory by around mid-2019.

Residents in the Woden, Molonglo Valley, Inner North, Inner South and Gungahlin will be invited to register for their green bin early next year. Green waste collections are already in place in Weston Creek and Tuggeranong. Belconnen collections start later this year.

A one-off fee of \$50 will be required to register for the program. Eligible concession card holders are exempt from payment.


