Don't delay, get tested today!

Recent COVID-19 outbreaks across the country have reinforced the importance of testing.

Getting tested means early detection of COVID-19 and allows ACT Health to quickly respond before there is widespread transmission.

You should get tested if you experience any COVID-19 symptoms – fever, sore throat, cough, runny or blocked nose, shortness of breath, or loss of smell or taste - no matter how mild they may be.

It is now mandatory to use the Check In CBR app in supermarkets, department stores, petrol stations, takeaway services, public transport, taxis, Uber and ride sharing services.

Everyone 16 years of age and older is required to check in, even if they are only in the venue for a brief amount of time

Gungahlin school expansions continue

Construction has started on the expansion of Amaroo School's senior campus, which will accommodate 200 more students for the 2022 school year.

The expansion includes new general and specialist learning areas for year 7 to 10 students and a refurbishment to the existing science and technology building.
