Message from the Chief Minister

Work has started on the expansion of Canberra's light rail network and the connection between civic and the Acton Waterfront in the west basin of Lake Burley Griffin.

The next step is to provide a level intersection between London Circuit and Commonwealth Avenue.

This major infrastructure project will impact some access roads to the CBD over the coming months and years.

We will be providing regular updates on changing travel and parking arrangements as the construction progresses.

More rebates available for eligible homeowners

The Home Energy Support Program has been expanded to offer more rebates for lower income homeowners. Eligible homeowners can now apply for rebates of:

- \$2,500 to install a rooftop solar system, and
- \$2,500 to install reverse cycle heating and cooling, a hot water heat pump, and/ or an electric stove top.

The Digital Health Record (DHR) will modernise the way health care is delivered and recorded across the ACT's public health system.

DHR will make it quicker and easier for medical professionals to access a patient's information, which will improve care and reduce the number of times they need to retell their story.




Be prepared for high-risk weather
