Canberra Hospital Expansion continues

Since construction commenced on the main structure in early 2022, the transformation at the Canberra Hospital Expansion Project site has been huge.

- 52,000m³ of soil excavated

 equivalent to 21 Olympic swimming pools
- 49,000m²: total building floor area
 equal to 251 tennis courts
- 1383m² the gross floor area of the 22 new operating theatres – equivalent to 350 king-size beds
- 556 windows, 155,000 bricks and 7500 façade panels
- three trucks have delivered 16 rolls (over 5km) of 400mm² high-voltage cable to power the all-electric building
- about 500 jobs created over the life of the project.

The project is scheduled for completion in 2024.

Sixty schools will benefit from upgrades this financial year. Improvements include new shade sails, inclusive upgrades, bike shelters and enhanced building facilities.

Rethink your routine this year

Light rail to Woden is coming, and there's no better time to think about how and when you travel into the city.

Construction is already underway on the raising of London Circuit, so why not keep the car at home and walk, cycle or take public transport?

A new bus timetable is now in place, with several changes made across the network, including to school services.

Alternatively, go halfway with Park and Ride facilities. EPIC Park and Ride features 300 allocated and overflow carparks, so you won't be hunting for a space. Well Station Drive Park and Ride offers 135 carparks and a Bike and Ride facility and there is also a Park and Ride facility at Gungahlin Town Centre.

Major investment in **Gungahlin roads**

More than \$150 million will be invested to repair and preserve Canberra's roads over the next four years.

The ACT Government manages more than 3,200km of sealed ACT roads, and this increased investment will see resurfacing of the network increase by 268,000m² a year.

The 2022–23 program is already underway in Gungahlin. Arterial road resealing will be carried out on roads including Gungahlin Drive, Horse Park Drive and Mirrabei Drive. Municipal roads, including in Mitchell and Bonner, are also being resealed.
