Message from the Chief Minister

The ACT Government has released updated district strategies, the new Territory Plan and new design guides, that will support more housing while retaining planning and design elements that have made Canberra one of the most liveable cities in the world.

The Government's objective is simple – more housing for Canberrans, where they want

to live. This includes proposed zoning changes to encourage a gentle increase in housing choices in existing suburbs.

Like all State and Territory governments around Australia, the ACT is using a combination of planning reforms, new suburban land release and tax reforms to increase housing supply and improve affordability.

More support for Canberra renters

The ACT Government is offering extra support measures for those who need it most. This includes the extension of the Rent Relief Fund, which provides targeted, short-term emergency support for private renters in low-income households in the ACT.

The fund offers grants for up to four weeks' rent capped at \$2,500 to help tenants and occupants maintain safe, secure and stable accommodation.

The ACT Government is also investing in a range of measures to increase the supply of affordable rentals in Canberra, with an aim to deliver 600 additional rental dwellings by 2025–26.





Free mammograms offer peace of mind

BreastScreen ACT offer free screening mammograms to eligible Canberrans over the age of 40. The service also actively encourages those aged 50–74 to have a mammogram every two years.

Prepare to vote in **The Voice Referendum**




With The Voice Referendum scheduled for Saturday, 14 October, it's time to identify your local polling place and prepare to vote 'yes' or 'no' on a single question:

Mowing and road resurfacing programs underway

With the warmer weather returning, you will now see mowers out and about each day.

A fleet of 82 mowers – including four electric vehicles – will help maintain the Territory and ensure it looks its best. The rapid response team of 10 extra staff and eight additional mowers will continue to focus on higher-priority areas such as those presenting safety issues. The annual road resurfacing program is also underway to maintain the road network. Road resurfacing helps to waterproof the road, improve skid resistance and fill in cracks in the pavement.





Telopea Park School turns 100

Canberra's oldest school, Telopea Park School in Barton, celebrates its 100th birthday this year.

In 1923, the first students to attend the school were the children of public servants, brickworks employees and construction workers involved in building the fledgling city of Canberra. Just 120 students were enrolled that year. Today, there are 1583 students between kindergarten and year 10 in the now French-Australian bilingual school.

Telopea Park School has celebrated its centenary with a range of tours, celebratory activities for staff and students and an exhibition at Canberra Museum and Gallery.

Lonsdale Street upgrades roll out

It's now safer and easier to move along the southern end of Lonsdale Street, with a new median and wider footpaths in place.

Further upgrades are underway on a crossing south of the rainbow roundabout, as well as the intersection with Girrahween Street.

The staged upgrades include pedestrian crossings, lighting and other features to improve this popular public space.


