As school returns for another year, the ACT Government is making sure every child has access to a great education.

Starting this year, all three-year-olds in the ACT can access 300 hours of free preschool education, ensuring quality early learning before school.

We know that getting ready for a new school year can be difficult for some families. To help cover some of the costs like uniforms, excursions, sports and music, eligible families will be able to access financial support through the ACT's Future of Education Equity Fund.

School's back for another year

With Canberra kids back in the classroom, now is the ideal time to take advantage of the ACT Government services available to parents and carers of school-aged children.

- **The Future of Education Equity Fund** is now open to help with back-to-school costs. Eligible families can seek assistance for education essentials such as book packs and uniforms.
- ACT three-year-olds can now benefit from 300 hours of **free preschool** at over 140 locations. This will save the average family around \$1,329 a year.
- Are you concerned about your child's development? The start of a new year is a good time to contact the **Child Development Service**, to access free drop-in clinics and assessments.

Next steps for light rail

Light Rail Stage 2A, connecting the city with Commonwealth Park, is coming. The ACT Government has signed a major works contract with long-time delivery partner Canberra Metro.

Stage 2A will extend the light rail network by 1.7 kilometres. This will add three new stops – at Edinburgh Avenue, City South and Commonwealth Park.

The extension will deliver improved public transport for the future, while helping shape the development of Canberra's city centre.

Work on Stage 2A is planned to begin in late 2024, with construction and testing expected to take approximately three years.

New Canberra Hospital building to open in 2024

Canberra Hospital's new Critical Services Building is due to open later this year.

The internal fit out will continue over the coming months, fitting state-of-the-art equipment and finalising modern and welcoming spaces for patients, visitors and staff.

The end result will deliver a bigger and better hospital with a larger emergency department, more operating theatres and more treatment spaces.

New and improved infrastructure in your region

It's going to be a big year for local infrastructure improvements.

Construction will begin on the new inner north play space in Watson, the design addressing community calls for shade, active travel, accessibility and diverse play and recreation options.

The Garden City Cycle Route will begin to take shape with construction starting on

its first stage, in Braddon.

The route will give Canberrans a safe and scenic cycle route through the suburbs to the east of Northbourne Avenue.

Upgrades to improve seating, paths and landscaping at the Narrabundah shops will soon get underway. Path and access improvements will also be made in O'Connor and Reid as part of the Age Friendly Suburbs Program.



It's time to stop it or **cop it**

Drivers detected using their mobile devices by mobile device detection cameras will start receiving fines from later this month.

If a camera detects you using your mobile device while driving, you will receive a fine and demerit points.

Three transportable cameras work 24 hours a day, seven days a week on major roads across Canberra, including Parkes Way and Commonwealth Avenue. Fixed cameras are also located on Hindmarsh Drive and Gungahlin Drive.
