# NEW MONCRIEFF PARK FOR NEXT SUMMER

A new fun and fitness recreation park is coming soon to Moncrieff. The park will offer a variety of facilities and equipment for the whole community.

It will include playgrounds to suit all ages, barbecue areas with picnic tables, seating and shade, bike racks, outdoor gym equipment, table tennis tables and volleyball and cricket nets.

Work has started on the corner of O'Keefe Avenue and Gussey Street. The park is expected to be ready for summer 2017.
