BUSINESS PARTNERSHIP PLAN UPDATE

DECEMBER 2023

INTRODUCTION

The CIT Campus – Woden project is delivering a modern Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT) campus, new public transport interchange, and additional community and commercial services to the Woden Town Centre.

CIT Woden will be a purpose-built vocational educational and training facility, providing excellence in education and learning outcomes for 6500 students each year.

The public transport interchange will support significantly improved bus services while enhancing public transport connectivity and safety to the area – with more bus stops, passenger-friendly shelters and enhanced lighting and signage. To keep Canberra moving, the transport interchange will also incorporate a light rail stop for Woden, ensuring the interchange is light rail ready for the network's future extension to Woden.

A youth foyer with up to 20 beds will also be delivered as part of the new campus to support young people who are at risk of, or are experiencing homelessness, by providing accommodation, support services and opportunities to pursue education and training in the one location.

The CIT Woden Campus will be connected to the public transport interchange via a new pedestrian boulevard, the first of three main urban realm spaces. The boulevard will be the central movement corridor set amongst native gardens and will include a series of spaces for public seating, outdoor dining and learning and retail frontage. To the western end of the campus there will be a family friendly plaza for people to relax, including a gathering and ceremony space. An additional northern plaza will provide a sunny break out space for students, public transport users and the public, with canopy trees and gardens providing wind and sun protection.

Purpose of this document

This Business Partnership Plan has been drafted under the ACT Government's Business Partnership Policy for major ACT Government infrastructure projects. It sets out the initiatives Major Projects Canberra is currently implementing with local businesses as well as future initiatives which will be implemented as construction works ramp up on the transport interchange and CIT campus (packages 2 and 3).

CIT Campus - Woden – Construction process

The project is being procured/delivered in four packages of work.

BUSINESS PARTNERSHIPS

Welcoming students from mid-2025, the CIT Campus -Woden project is expected to bring more than 6500 students into Woden each year and deliver significant and lasting benefits to local businesses in and around the Woden Town Centre.


This Business Partnership Plan sets out the activities and support services being implemented during the construction of packages 1-3 of this project to address potential disruption for local businesses.

Eligible businesses

For the purposes of this Plan, an 'eligible business' is a business that physically operates in the immediate area around the project's main construction zones. The map below outlines the general area impacted by construction works.

Eligible businesses range from large employers in the area such as ACT and Federal health departments to local small-to-medium businesses and nearby apartment complexes. This list continues to evolve over the life of the project and, as such, is reviewed regularly to ensure changes to construction impacts and/or business operations are being responded to appropriately.

The ACT Government recognises that some businesses further afield may also be impacted by flow-on construction impacts and in these instances would be eligible for outreach communications and business relationship management.

Overview of proposed partnership initiatives

The following table summarises the partnership initiatives the ACT Government is undertaking with eligible businesses under this Business Partnership Plan:

Note: In accordance with the ACT Government's *Business Partnership Policy – Major Projects*, the ACT Government does not make direct financial payments to businesses affected by the construction of public infrastructure, nor does the ACT Government provide payment relief in relation to rates, taxes, rents or other charges payable to the ACT Government.

Business Relationship Managers

A Business Relationship Manager is a member of the ACT Government Major Projects Canberra team who will act as a central point of contact for all your needs in relation to the project. This person can:

- be your point of contact on the project and coordinate any correspondence, meeting or activities;
- provide information regarding the project, including the provision of information about timing and scope of key construction activities;
- receive questions, feedback, complaints or compliments regarding the project.

Your Business Relationship Manager can also relay any queries back to the ACT Government's works delivery partner to ensure your feedback is considered and where possible incorporated into the construction approach.

Construction notices and scheduling

An early works program was developed in consultation with local businesses, with adjustments made on a case-by-case basis to help mitigate impacts to local businesses and operations. These preparatory works were completed in January 2023, with local businesses and stakeholders kept regularly informed on program, construction approach and impacts during this time.

With the commencement of the main construction work in early 2023, information on the proposed construction schedule and project status is being shared on a regular basis with businesses and stakeholders in the local CIT Woden campus precinct area.

Hoardings and signage have been established as part of current works and will continue to change and evolve as works progress. The below activities were run in 2022-2023 to provide businesses and customers the opportunity to engage with the CIT Woden Campus project team and to share the latest construction activity and project updates:

Engagement prior to Development Approval (DA)	August 2022	Initial community engagement including YourSay consultation prior to DA submission. Invitation to local businesses and residents to join the Community Reference Group (CRG).
Notice of closures	Ad-hoc	Advance notice provided by Lendlease of road closures and other traffic impacting activities.
Construction Activity Updates	Monthly	2,200 printed flyers distributed to businesses within a 100m radius of the site footprint and also published on the <u>CIT Woden Campus</u> <u>website</u> . eDM sent to Construction Activity Update subscribers.
Project Updates	Every 3-4 months	12,582 printed flyers distributed to local businesses and surrounding suburbs, and also published on the <u>CIT Woden Campus website</u> . eDM sent to Project Update subscribers.
Community Reference Group	Fortnightly	In person meetings at the Construction Employment Hub every second Monday, running from August to December 2022 to inform about early works and solicit feedback around the DA submissions.
Construction Information Group meetings	Monthly	Ongoing in-person/online meetings starting in January 2023 led by Lendlease to provide construction updates to highly impacted businesses in the area.
Construction Activity Update feedback survey	December 2023	Survey accessed via a QR code printed in the December Construction Activity Update flyer
Door knocking		In person pre-arranged appointments with Construction Information Group (CIG) and Community Reference Group (CRG) members. Drop-in visits to all other identified businesses within a 500m radius of the site footprint.

Preferred supplier initiatives

Where appropriate, Major Projects Canberra and its construction partners will ensure local business are prioritised as preferred suppliers for the project.

A preferred supplier list is distributed to the various businesses involved in the Project. Preferred suppliers can offer a range of goods and services, including catering, accommodation and meeting/conference facilities.

Preferred supplier list	Ad-hoc	A list of businesses in the Woden area, generally within a 100m radius of the site footprint. Preferred supplier list shared with ACT Government staff, Lendlease workers and other construction partners as relevant.
Menu / business card drops	Ad-hoc	Take-away menus and business cards from preferred supplier list businesses distributed in ACT Government Major Projects Canberra and Lendlease site offices.

Business Activation Program

The Business Activation Program involves partnerships and programs between the ACT Government and businesses in the area to attract customers during construction and ensure the area remains attractive, safe and easy to navigate for community use.

The below initiatives were run in 2022-2023 to attract customers into the area surrounding the CIT Woden Campus construction zone:

Easty Street artwork launch	November 2023	Installation of artwork by local artist Steven Kennedy on driver amenities block.
Hoarding around construction site	September 2023	Fence shade cloth wraps providing wayfinding and directional signage as well as conceptual images of the development future state.
Name the Crane event	December 2023	Primary school students involved in the naming of the two construction cranes invited to an on-site naming ceremony.
Woden Interchange artwork launch	December 2023	Installation of artwork by local artists on Woden transport interchange shelters.
