### **CARGILL'S COTTAGE THE CAUSEWAY - BLOCK 3 SECTION 38 FYSHWICK AND, BLOCKS 1 AND 2 SECTION 33 KINGSTON**

The nomination was given to the Council on 19 September 2025 and accepted at meeting 138 on 19 November 2025.

Cargill's Cottage is associated with one of the ACT's first four dairy leases, established by the Federal Capital Commission, and closely linked to Canberra's early development and agricultural economy.

The place is connected to David Cargill, a prominent figure in Canberra's dairy industry and other early social and economic activities.

The place has a strong and special association with The Causeway community, providing employment and shaping local life for generations.

It offers potential for education on themes like food production for the capital, Scottish contributions, rural co-operatives, and soldier settler history.

The cottage and its infrastructure may yield important information about early dairy operations and Canberra's rural heritage.
