FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (FOI) REQUEST

I refer to your application under section 30 of the *Freedom of Information Act 2016* (the FOI Act), received by the Education Directorate (the Directorate) on 24 July 2026, in which you sought access to:

Records of a meeting on 24 February 2020 between the Minister for Education and Education Directorate representatives, specifically the diary/calendar entry, names of invitees and participants, meeting agenda and notes held by meeting participants.

I am an Information Officer appointed by the Director-General under section 18 of the FOI Act to deal with access applications made under Part 5 of the FOI Act.

In accordance with section 40 of the FOI Act, the Directorate was required to provide a decision on your access application within 30 working days of receipt, being 4 September 2026.

Decision on access

Searches were completed for relevant records, and two records were identified that fall within the scope of your request. Unfortunately, no information could be located for part of your request, specifically any notes held by meeting participants. This is because some of the invitees are no longer employed by the Directorate. For those invitees that are still employed by the Directorate, they either do not hold any relevant records, or they were an invitee for the purpose of being aware the meeting was scheduled, but they did not attend.

My decision is to grant full access to the records.

I have included as Attachment A to this decision the schedule of relevant records. This provides a description of each record.

The records released to you are provided as Attachment B to this letter.

Charges

Processing charges are not applicable for this request because the number of pages released is less than 50, which is the threshold set at section 104(4) of the FOI Act.

Online publishing – disclosure log

Under section 28 of the FOI Act, the Directorate maintains an online record of access applications called a disclosure log. Information about your request, my decision and records released to you in response to your access application will be published in the Directorate's disclosure log between three and 10 working days after a decision on access has been provided to you. Your personal information will not be published.

Review of decision**Ombudsman review**

My decision on your access request is a reviewable decision as identified in Schedule 3 of the FOI Act.
