New company EpiAxis Therapeutics Pty Ltd recently received government approval to work out of the University of Canberra to bring a revolutionary breast cancer treatment to market and create jobs for Canberrans in the health sector.

SUPPORT FOR NEW

Changes to ACT Government planning regulations in 2015 paved the way for the construction of a new state-of-the-art cancer centre at the University of Canberra which opened in February. The Radiation Oncology Centre will increase the availability of radiation and medical oncology services in the ACT.





In the next 20 years, Canberra's population is set to increase by a third, with almost 500,000 people calling our city home by 2035.


Canberrans need a modern transport system that can meet the requirements of our growing and changing city and offer a genuine alternative to driving.

MAKING KALEEN MORE AGE-FRIENDLY

Kaleen has been selected as the next pilot suburb in the ACT Government's Age Friendly Suburbs Active Travel project. The project will improve local infrastructure and facilities to make it easier for older residents to get around.

Kaleen was chosen based on its demographic profile and follows Ainslie and Weston whose residents were consulted in late 2015. Community feedback from consultations held in March will help develop a list of priority improvements for the suburb to be designed and constructed over the next financial year.
