
#### LAND AVAILABLE EST SOON IN GINNINDERRY

West Belconnen's new community, Ginninderry is taking shape.

Sustainability is at the heart of the development, which will be Canberra's first Green Building Council of Australia Six Star, Green Star Community.

Ginninderry will have 11,500 new dwellings over the next 30-40 years in four new suburbs and will feature 800 hectares of protected open space.

The first blocks of land will be released from 9 April.





## **SECURING CANBERRA'S ELECTRICITY SUPPLY**

Plans are underway to secure Canberra's electricity supply with the construction of a third independent electrical substation.

The substation will be built by ActewAGL and network operator Transgrid on rural land near Stockdill Drive in West Belconnen. It will act as a secondary connection to the national electricity grid.

The community can comment on the project later this year when the Environmental Impact Statement is released for public consultation.
