CONTAINER PLAY PODS FOR LEARNING

The fun play items from the Green Shed are creating a real buzz during the breaks.

To promote creative play, two shipping containers have been installed as 'play pods' in the playgrounds of Ainslie Primary School.

Inside is an Aladdin's cave of wonders, with items provided free by the Green

Shed. There are pipes, timber, milk crates, wheels, crutches, baskets and many other loose parts.

Teachers say students used to look for things to do during breaks, but now there is a real buzz. Excited children race to explore in the play pods. They are learning, having fun and developing important social skills.

A 'GARDEN CITY' FUTURE FOR BRICKWORKS

A 'garden city' development of 380 homes, with a balanced mix of commercial and community uses, is coming to the Canberra Brickworks heritage precinct in Yarralumla.

The Brickworks development will be a mix of stand-alone houses, terraces and apartments. The design will ensure the heritage and history of the Brickworks is preserved for future generations.

Canberra developer Doma Group has been selected to build the development. This followed a thorough tender process that included input from a community panel.



MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF MINISTER, ANDREW BARR

With work well underway on the first stage of our city-wide light rail network, we have asked Canberrans to help shape the route for stage two of the project – linking the City to Woden town centre.

Light rail to Woden involves crossing the lake and going through the Parliamentary Triangle and, by 2041, almost 90,000 people will live within one kilometre of stage 2. Have your say on exactly where the route goes, and where the stops are located.

Since we asked Canberrans their views in early May, we've had a huge amount of constructive feedback. There is still some time to have your say on stage 2. Visit yoursay.act.gov.au before this phase of consultation closes on Sunday 11 June.

NEW AUTHORITY TO RENEW OUR CITY CENTRE



Canberra's new City Renewal Authority starts operating next month. It will focus on breathing new life into the city centre and Dickson.

The new authority will support development of public spaces and buildings around Northbourne Avenue and will create West Basin's new lakeside precinct. The authority will take the same successful precinct based approach as Brisbane's Southbank and Perth's Elizabeth Quay. It will have a board of directors and expertise in design, engineering, sustainability, community building and administration.

NEW AGENCY TO FOCUS ON OUR SUBURBS

Starting from 1 July is the new Suburban Land Agency, focusing on our suburbs. It will deliver greenfield residential estates, land releases and affordable housing, as well as urban renewal projects in town centres and suburbs.

MORE EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS FOR REFUGEES

More refugees and asylum seekers in the ACT now have access to training in areas of skills shortage.

The eligibility criteria for the Australian Apprenticeships and Skilled Capital programs have been expanded. It now includes refugees and asylum seekers on temporary and bridging visas. The changes provide more employment opportunities for our newest Canberrans.

NEW NATURAL PLAY SPACES IN BARTON & O'CONNOR

O'Connor and Barton will soon be home to some new natural play areas for local kids to enjoy.

Telopea Park in Barton will feature a campfire style social spot, timber post maze, pipe tunnels for exploring, freestyle logs and stepping stones.

At Finn Street in O'Connor, children will enjoy a new natural amphitheatre and a loose parts shop with small objects to build and create. Additional trees and plants will form natural goal posts. Construction has started at both locations.

NEW MEDIA CENTRE HELPS MANUKA MEET THE TEST

A new permanent media centre will be built at Manuka Oval in time for Canberra's first cricket Test match in the 2018/19 season.

The design will meet International Cricket Council standards. It will also take into account key principles developed with the community. These include a high quality building to complement the precinct's heritage aspects, and for easily accessible multi-purpose function spaces.



NEW HOUSING OPTIONS FOR RED HILL

A plan for the former public housing precinct in Red Hill provides the opportunity for a variety of new housing options and high-quality public spaces.

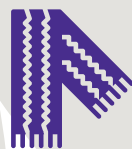
The estate development plan was produced in consultation with the local community. Three community workshops helped shape the site that allows for a maximum of 252 dwellings. These consist of 108 single residential blocks of various sizes as well as between 83 and 144 multi-unit dwellings.

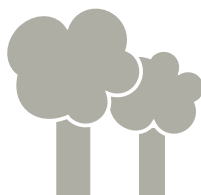
WARM TREES AT THE NATIONAL ARBORETUM
