Protect yourself from the flu

Get the flu vaccine before winter to help keep yourself and your family well.

Everyone aged six months and older should get vaccinated – particularly those most at risk of complications from getting the flu. The vaccine is free for some people and is available from GPs, pharmacies, Early Childhood Immunisation Centres and some workplaces.

Many people will be getting vaccinated against the flu and COVID-19 this year. It's important to know the differences between these vaccines, how they will protect you and where to get them.

COVID-19 vaccine rollout



Phase 1a

- Health care workers working in high-risk exposure and transmission areas
- Quarantine and border workers
- Residents and staff of aged care and disability residential care facilities



Phase 1b

- People 70 years and over
- Other health care workers, including aged and disability care
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people 55 years and older
- Adults with a specified medical condition
- Adults living with a significant disability requiring frequent assistance with activities of daily living
- People with a disability or age-related condition and attend centre-based services
- Critical and high-risk workers including defence, police, fire, emergency services and meat processing
- Household contacts of quarantine and border workers
- Other eligible individuals like:
 - Carers (paid and unpaid) of people in 1a and 1b
 - Carers of children with specified underlying medical conditions
 - Disability and aged care support volunteers

People in 1b will be required to demonstrate or self-declare their eligibility.



Phase 2a

- Adults aged 50-69
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people 18-54
- Other critical and high-risk workers



Phase 2b

- Balance of adult population
- Catch up any unvaccinated people from previous phases
