Chapter Summary: Air Quality



The Raising London Circuit project has been assessed to have a low risk of impacting air quality. The Project may produce air emissions during construction from the combustion of diesel fuel, and dust from exposed soil.

The Project has the following air quality performance goals:

- No visible dust beyond the Project boundary
- No unnecessary vehicle combustion emissions
- No soil track-out onto public roads.



Key steps we are taking to manage construction impacts on air quality include:



Operation of machinery and dust causing activities would be undertaken as far away as possible from places where people may be exposed to dust and emissions.



Construction activities will be planned and evaluated daily to consider the expected weather conditions.



Ensure cement and fine materials are delivered so as to prevent material escape.



Keep vehicles and construction equipment turned off when not operating (minimise idling on the site).

After the completion of construction all disturbed areas will be reinstated, and areas of exposed soil would be paved or vegetated.
