### **Big batteries** to power Canberra

The ACT Government continues to invest in renewable energy, with large scale batteries to help the city store and release energy as Canberrans need it.

The 'Big Canberra Battery' will be made up of an ecosystem of batteries across the city to make the most of

the energy we get through wind and solar. It's construction supports the Government's priority to become a net zero emissions city.

Work is currently underway to find a provider to build these batteries across Canberra.



### Save energy this winter

Save money, stay warm and support the environment this winter with these energy-saving tips:

- ▶ Cover your windows to keep the warmth in.
- Set your heater to 18-21 degrees

   every degree warmer adds up
   to 10 per cent to your bill.
- Seal gaps around doors and windows.
- Open the curtains during the day to use the sun's warmth.
- ▶ Add an extra layer of clothing before turning the heater up.
