

CIT Woden Campus Construction Activity Update

What's happening on site in July



The CIT Woden Campus project will bring state of the art learning facilities, a new public transport interchange, improved active travel and vibrant public spaces to Woden.

This update summarises upcoming construction activities and expected disruptions relating to this project.

Concrete pour and cranes arriving

Excavation of the basement is now complete. The excavation saw approx. 25,000m³ of fill removed from the site by almost 1,400 truck movements.

Work is commencing on in-ground services and the concrete pour for the 'northern pod' slab that runs parallel to Callam Street.

Work has also started to prepare the site for the arrival of two tower cranes. These cranes will be positioned on the southern and northern edges of the site and will help carry the loads needed to lift the building's structure out of the ground.

The project will be using electric cranes. These eco-friendly cranes will not only minimise noise but also reduce fossil fuel pollution, aligning with the project's commitment to sustainability.

These cranes are fitted with the latest safety technology including a system that doesn't allow them to swing with loads outside the site perimeter over neighbouring buildings or public spaces.

Also taking place this month is the installation of wayfinding information across the site perimeter fencing.

NOW:

- In-ground services such as water, drainage and electricity.
- Stormwater installation on Callam Street.
- Lift core works and basement slab preparation.

SOON:

- Pouring of the northern pod slab
- Cranes arrive onsite.
- Installation of wayfinding information on site perimeter fencing.

LATER:

- Timber structure gets underway.

Callam Street works – stormwater installation

Stormwater installation is underway on Callam Street as part of work on the new public transport interchange. These works will improve drainage by updating key in-ground infrastructure in the area.

Work on installing the stormwater pipe is expected to take several months.

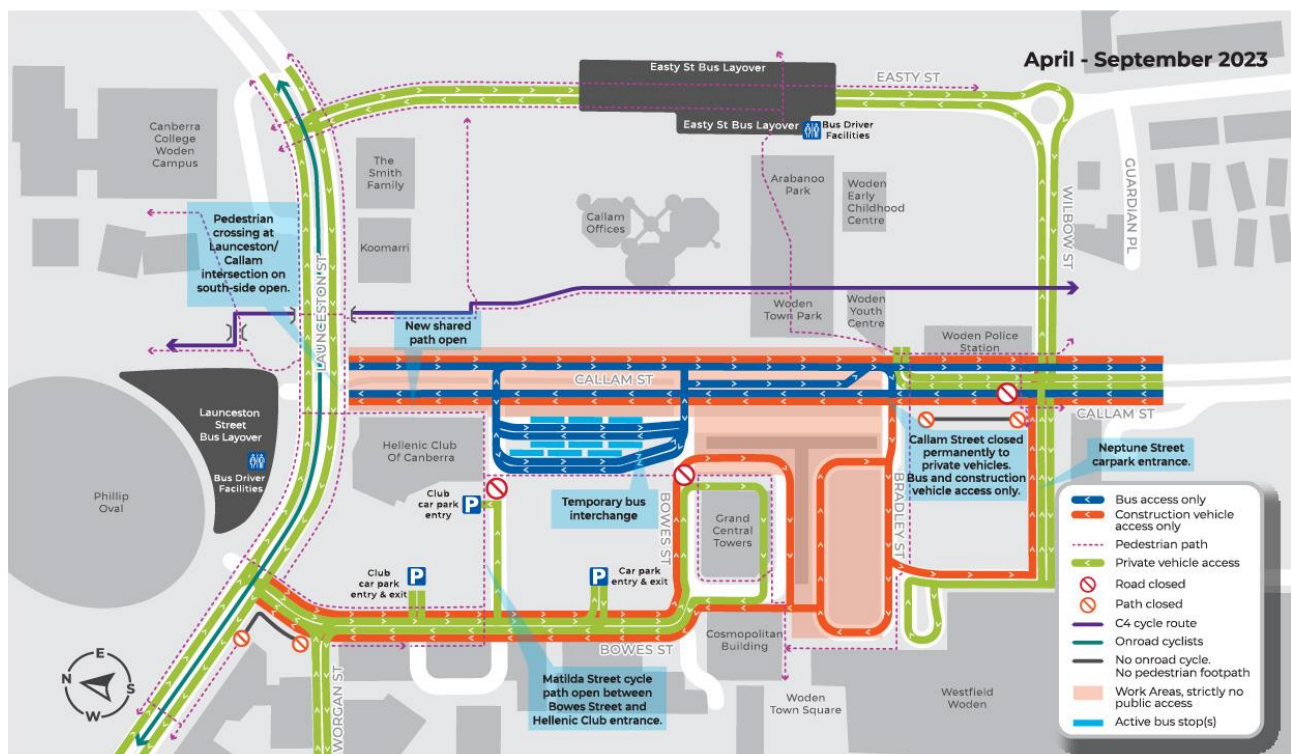
Efforts are being made to minimise disruptions and ensure the safety of commuters. Pedestrians and cyclists are reminded to use the designated pathway during this period.

How works could affect you

While every effort is made to minimise construction disruption and impacts to the community, at times, you can expect to experience higher levels of noise and dust, traffic, pedestrian, and cyclist changes involving detours and an increase in construction vehicle movements.

Activities will be monitored by Lendlease and adjustments made where needed to minimise community impacts. All work is weather dependent and subject to change.

Road closures, traffic control and pedestrian diversions continue to be in place. Refer to the map below on the status.
