Message from the Chief Minister

National cost-of-living pressures are causing financial challenges for many Canberra households.

There are ACT Government programs to help Canberrans with everyday costs including energy bills, health care and transport. There are also programs to assist with sustainable home upgrades and support to rent or buy a home.

The recent ACT Budget included further cost of living relief, including expanding the Utilities Concession eligibility criteria to support more households with the costs of heating and cooling their homes. Around one in five Canberra households are now eligible for support with their energy bills.

Refreshed website provides support

The ACT Government's cost of living website makes it easier for eligible Canberrans to find support for energy, rates, education, health and transport costs.

Apply for help with energy bills

If you have an eligible concession card, you can apply for the Utilities Concession. This will give you up to \$800 off your energy bills in 2023–24. You can apply via your energy provider.

The Utilities Concession is applied to your electricity bill and covers electricity, natural gas, water and sewerage and is calculated on a daily basis, with rates depending on the season.

Get free health care at a Walk-in Centre

Canberrans can receive free health care at one of Canberra's five Walk-in Centres.

Nurses provide free assessment and treatment of non-life-threatening injuries and illnesses. Anyone over one year of age can attend – with or without a Medicare card.

The centres are open 365 days a year, 7.30am to 10pm, in Belconnen, Tuggeranong, Dickson, Weston and Gungahlin. No appointment is necessary.

Initiatives to help reduce your cost of living

The ACT Government has a number of initiatives available to help support eligible Canberrans with the cost of living. These include:

- Assistance with the cost of energy bills via the Utilities Concession
- Free or discounted travel on ACT public transport
- · Rates rebate or deferral
- Help paying for school essentials via the Education Equity Fund
- · Discounted vehicle registration and licence renewal
- Free health care at a Walk-in Centre
- · Interest-free rental bond loans
- Fee-free TAFE to train, retrain or upskill
- Free advice to save money on home energy and water bills.

Construction begins on foreshore upgrades

Work to improve the Lake Tuggeranong foreshore begins this month.

The project aims to create a more welcoming and appealing space by:

- upgrading Tuggeranong Town Park playground with picnic areas and accessible play equipment
- replacing the existing toilet with new, accessible facilities
- upgrading shared paths, adding more places to sit and relax
- improving signs to help people find their way around the foreshore.

Visitors can also expect more bike and footpaths to better connect areas, plus improvements to public access and safety features.

Construction is expected to take around 12 months, weather permitting. Where possible, work will be completed in stages.

New health centre coming to Conder



new health centre in Conder. The centre will be built on the corner of Box Hill Avenue and Heidelberg Street, across from the primary school. Located near Lanyon Marketplace, the centre will be conveniently close to public transport and will complement other health services in the area.

Design of the new facility will kick off soon. It will have flexible spaces that can adapt to a range of health services, ensuring the care provided at the centre meets the needs of the Tuggeranong community.
