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Policy Statement

The ACT Health Directorate:

- prohibits smoking (which includes vaping) at any ACT Health Directorate (ACTHD) owned or controlled workplace, facility or event at any time, and
- supports smoking cessation programs for staff.

Purpose

The purpose of the Smoke Free Environment Policy (Policy) is to:

- support positive health outcomes by eliminating the exposure of any person at ACTHD facilities to environmental smoke and personal vapouriser aerosols
- ensure that ACTHD complies with the Smoke-Free Public Places Act 2003
- assist managers and staff to safely, and effectively, enforce the smoke free environment
- encourage and support staff to become and remain smoke free through the Wellbeing strategy and <u>HealthHQ</u>, and
- place ACTHD as a leader in promotion of health through the provision of healthier public places and facilities.

Scope

This policy applies to all staff and any person who enters:

- ACTHD occupied or owned premises, including those being leased or provided to other parties
- the grounds of those premises, including car parks
- events organised by ACTHD, and
- ACTHD owned or leased vehicle.

Roles and Responsibilities

Position	Responsibility
Executive Group Managers, Executive Branch Managers and equivalent positions Senior Directors and Directors and equivalent positions	Take practical measures to identify, implement and communicate strategies to control smoking and exposure to environmental tobacco smoke and personal vapouriser aerosols at ACT Health facilities.
	Ensure that:
	 all staff are informed of their responsibility to adhere to this Policy, and
	 the Policy is applied in an appropriate and consistent manner.
	Maintain awareness of information and resources available on the ACT Health internet and intranet sites.
	Ensure that information about the Policy is clearly communicated to all organisations that lease, occupy or use ACTHD controlled facilities.
	Provide support to staff to become and remain smoke free at work, including:
	 individual or group support
	 appropriate nicotine therapy, and/or
	• other assistance to address nicotine dependence.
	Manage non-compliance with this Policy in accordance with our values, the code of conduct or performance management procedures.
	Address complaints relating to monitoring or implementation of the Policy relevant to their area.
All staff	Comply with the smoke free workplace requirements.
	Inform all people on ACT Health sites or facilities of their responsibility to comply with the smoke free workplace requirements.
People Strategy and Culture Branch	Support the implementation of the Policy and wellbeing promotion in the workplace.

Facility	A place, amenity, or piece of equipment provided for a particular purpose, ACT Health controlled buildings, grounds and vehicles, including those being leased or provided under an agreement to other parties.
Staff	Any person performing work for ACT Health, on a permanent, temporary or casual basis, including employees, volunteers, contractors, students, consultants, and researchers performing work within ACT Health owned or controlled facilities.
Smoke	Means:
	 smoke from an ignited smoking product, or
	 vapour from a personal vapouriser.
	Note: A personal vapouriser is a smoking product.
	Source: Smoke-Free Public Places Act 2003.

Visitors	Any non-staff person entering an ACT Health owned or controlled facility, for any purpose whatsoever.
