MAKING AINSLIE MORE AGE-FRIENDLY TYPE

Plans have been released for active travel improvements in Ainslie as part of the Age Friendly Suburbs Active Travel project.

Path replacement, kerb ramp upgrades, new lighting and changes to pedestrian refuge islands are some of the priority one improvements that will be rolled out in Ainslie to make it easier for older residents to get around. The improvements come after nearly 90 per cent of Ainslie residents consulted asked to see better footpaths and road crossing improvements. Construction of the work is scheduled to begin in May 2016.







CANBERRA BRICKWORKS SITE GOES TO MARKET

The I6-ha Canberra Brickworks Precinct site will go to the market in early April in a two-stage sale process.

This significant urban renewal project will restore and activate the Brickworks industrial site and immediate surrounding areas.

The ACT Government's Land Development Agency worked with a community panel on the objectives for the project which includes the use of the heritage-listed Brickworks and residential development.

By accommodating many of Canberra's leading visual arts organisations, the precinct will transform the Kingston Foreshore into a hive of creative activity.


