A community facility called 'The Link' is now open at Ginninderry, west Belconnen's newest community. It's a hub where groups and organisations can come together and meet.

The Link is also an entry point and visitor centre for the conservation corridor that runs along the Murrumbidgee River and Ginninderra Creek.

The cross border community of Ginninderry includes the new Belconnen suburbs of Strathnairn and Macnamara. It will have 11,500 new dwellings over the next 30-40 years.


#### **IMPROVING YOUR LOCAL DOG PARK**

Do you need to be registered? If you are not sure, take the online survey at act.gov.au/wwvptakethetest.


The WWVP Scheme is an important way to protect children and vulnerable members of our community.

A new bus service now connects Canberra Airport to Civic. Bus route 11 operates every half hour on weekdays and every hour on weekends.

The duplication of Aikman Drive between Ginninderra Drive and Emu Bank is progressing well, with around 50 percent of the works completed.

Underground utility works including the construction of new stormwater infrastructure are complete. Work will soon ramp up at the Joy Cummings Place intersection. The project is due for completion in late 2017 ahead of the opening of the University of Canberra Public Hospital.





We know how important mowing of public spaces is to Canberrans, especially for those who love to get outdoors in our bush capital.

There's now an online map to track mowing across the city. The map shows where mowing has been done and which suburbs are next.

It can also alert you of any delays to the mowing schedule due to wet weather or high fire danger. The map is updated every week.

# LOWER YOUR ENERGY BILLS THIS WINTER

Canbrrrr...winter is coming. Here are some tips on how to stay warm and keep your energy bills low.

- Draught-proof your house using door sweeps and weather strip your windows.
- Have your gas or reverse cycle heating systems serviced, including duct work.
- Ensure your ceiling insulation has an R-value of 5 or better and install good window coverings.
- Turn off heating overnight, when not at home, and in unused rooms.
- Make sure your hot water pipes are well insulated.
