HELP SHAPE LIGHT RAIL TO WODEN



There's still time. Consultation closes 11 June

There's still some time to have your say on the route for stage two of the light rail network to Woden.

Light rail will link Gungahlin and the City to Woden. It will form a public transport spine for Canberra, linking major retail, entertainment precincts, employment hubs and education institutions to the suburbs.

The conversation is still open on the 'Your Say' website. Your voice will help influence route options, stop locations, alignment and identify items or locations of interest. All community feedback will inform future planning decisions. More opportunities to have your say are still to come.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF MINISTER, ANDREW BARR

With work well underway on the first stage of our city-wide light rail network, we have asked Canberrans to help shape the route for stage two of the project – linking the City to Woden town centre.

Light rail to Woden involves crossing the lake and going through the Parliamentary Triangle and, by 2041, almost 90,000 people will live within one kilometre of stage 2. Have your say on exactly where the route goes, and where the stops are located.

Since we asked Canberrans their views in early May, we've had a huge amount of constructive feedback. There is still some time to have your say on stage 2. Visit yoursay.act.gov.au before this phase of consultation closes on Sunday 11 June.

NEW AUTHORITY TO RENEW OUR CITY CENTRE



Canberra's new City Renewal Authority starts operating next month. It will focus on breathing new life into the city centre and Dickson.

The new authority will support development of public spaces and buildings around Northbourne Avenue and will create West Basin's new lakeside precinct. The authority will take the same successful precinct based approach as Brisbane's Southbank and Perth's Elizabeth Quay. It will have a board of directors and expertise in design, engineering, sustainability, community building and administration.

NEW AGENCY TO FOCUS ON OUR SUBURBS

Starting from 1 July is the new Suburban Land Agency, focusing on our suburbs. It will deliver greenfield residential estates, land releases and affordable housing, as well as urban renewal projects in town centres and suburbs.

MORE EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS FOR REFUGEES

More refugees and asylum seekers in the ACT now have access to training in areas of skills shortage.

The eligibility criteria for the Australian Apprenticeships and Skilled Capital programs have been expanded. It now includes refugees and asylum seekers on temporary and bridging visas. The changes provide more employment opportunities for our newest Canberrans.

A 'GARDEN CITY' FUTURE FOR BRICKWORKS

A 'garden city' development of 380 homes, with a balanced mix of commercial and community uses, is coming to the Canberra Brickworks heritage precinct in Yarralumla.

The Brickworks development will be a mix of stand-alone houses, terraces and apartments. The design will ensure the heritage and history of the Brickworks is preserved for future generations.

Canberra developer Doma Group has been selected to build the development. This followed a thorough tender process that included input from a community panel.



HINDMARSH INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS

Works are almost complete at the two Hindmarsh Drive intersections at Eggleston Crescent and Launceston Street.

New traffic lights have been installed. These lights will improve safety and make access easier for cars and buses entering and exiting Hindmarsh Drive from Lyons and Chifley.

NEW EXERCISE STATION INSTALLED

Woden's Eddison Park now has a new outdoor exercise station.

The equipment includes a sit up bench, seated rower, leg press, chest press, leg raise and dip bars. The new fitness station adds to Canberra's network of fitness equipment across 20 suburbs.

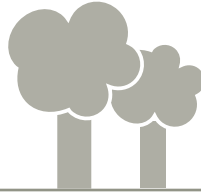
WARM TREES AT THE NATIONAL ARBORETUM
