Bulky waste collections coming first to Tuggeranong

Tuggeranong residents will be able to make bookings for bulky waste collection from July.

The new service will provide a convenient and accessible way to dispose of unwanted large and bulky household items.

Tuggeranong households will be able to book one collection per year of up to two cubic metres for items including damaged furniture and worn-out household appliances.
