Public safety will be ensured at all times before and after pine wilding control is undertaken.

In areas of dense forest canopy, pine wilding once cut will be removed to ground level to ensure public safety is not threatened by falling trees at a later date.

Stumps will be cut as close to ground level as possible.

Plants that are less than 0.5 metres in height will be hand pulled and completely removed from the ground.

1 Removal of pine wildings

Note: Pine Wilding Control is the removal of Pinus radiata that has naturally propagated from planted stands in undesirable areas such as high conservation areas, native forest, and borders with other land managers. The aim is to reduce competition with native species and to increase the habitat value and visual amenity of the area.

This includes the following services:

Removal of pine wildings from Territory land using manual or mechanical methods – loppers, handsaw and chainsaw, in accordance with the following methodology:

Pine wildings must be felled manually or mechanically with regard to the following:

- a) *all stems must be cut below the lowest green needle;*
- b) *the stump must be one third of the stump diameter or less in height;*
