



## INVESTIGATION WORKS AND UPCOMING CAR PARK CHANGES

The ACT Government is building light rail to Woden to help make Canberra a more connected, sustainable, and vibrant city.

As part of the design and planning for light rail to Woden we need to find out where services are located under the ground and what the land conditions are like. This helps us plan to minimise impacts to the community in the future.

The upcoming works includes:



Topographic surveying of underground services using electromagnetic detection techniques



Reinstatement works in road pavements and verges

Work will involve the following activities:

- Service locations
- Road and verge reinstatement works including vibration compaction

### Noise

We expect this work to generate some noise typical of a construction site, but it will be localised to the area where works are being undertaken. We will endeavour to minimise noise impacts where possible.

## Working hours

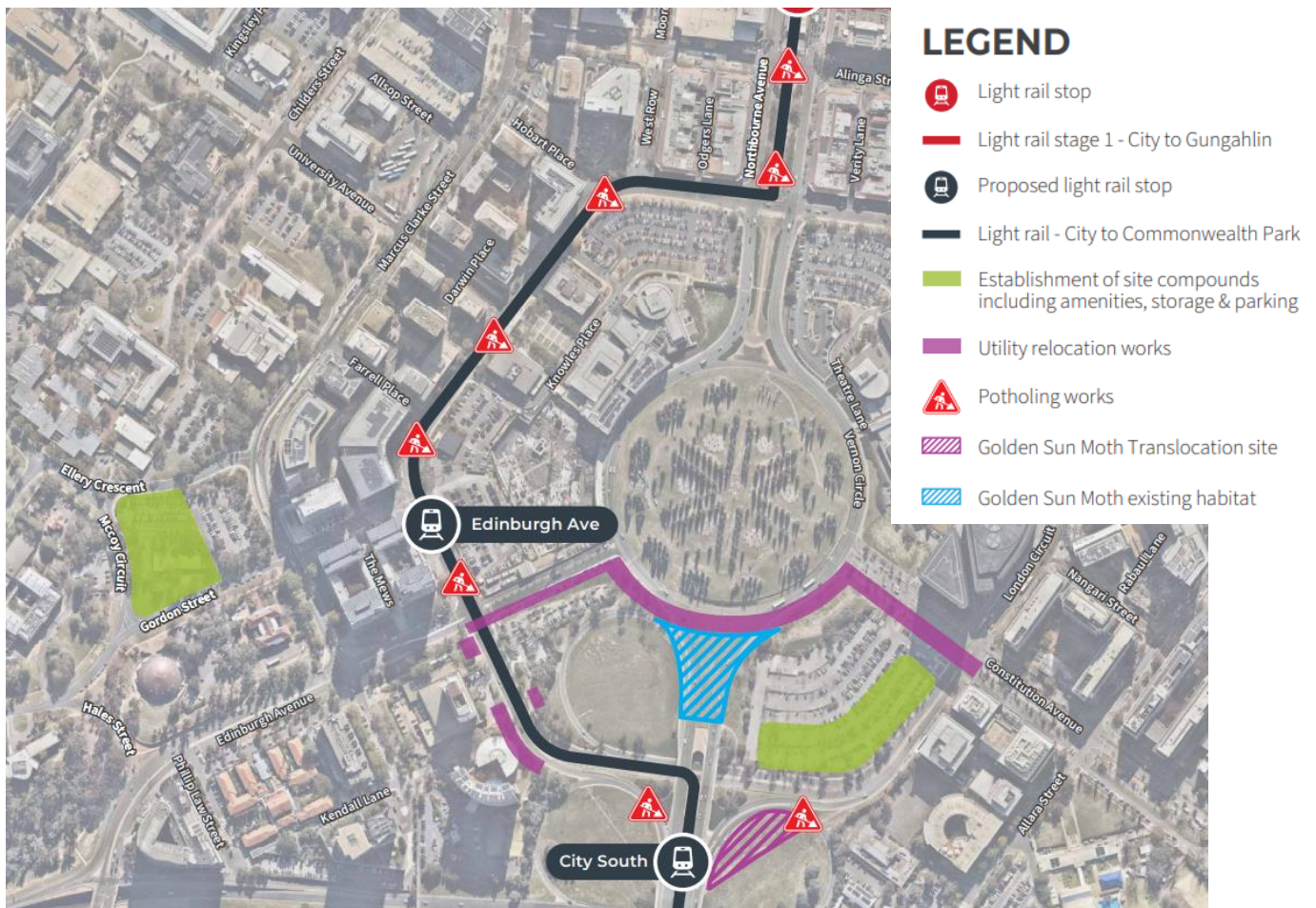
All construction activities are dependent on weather conditions. Expected working hours are:

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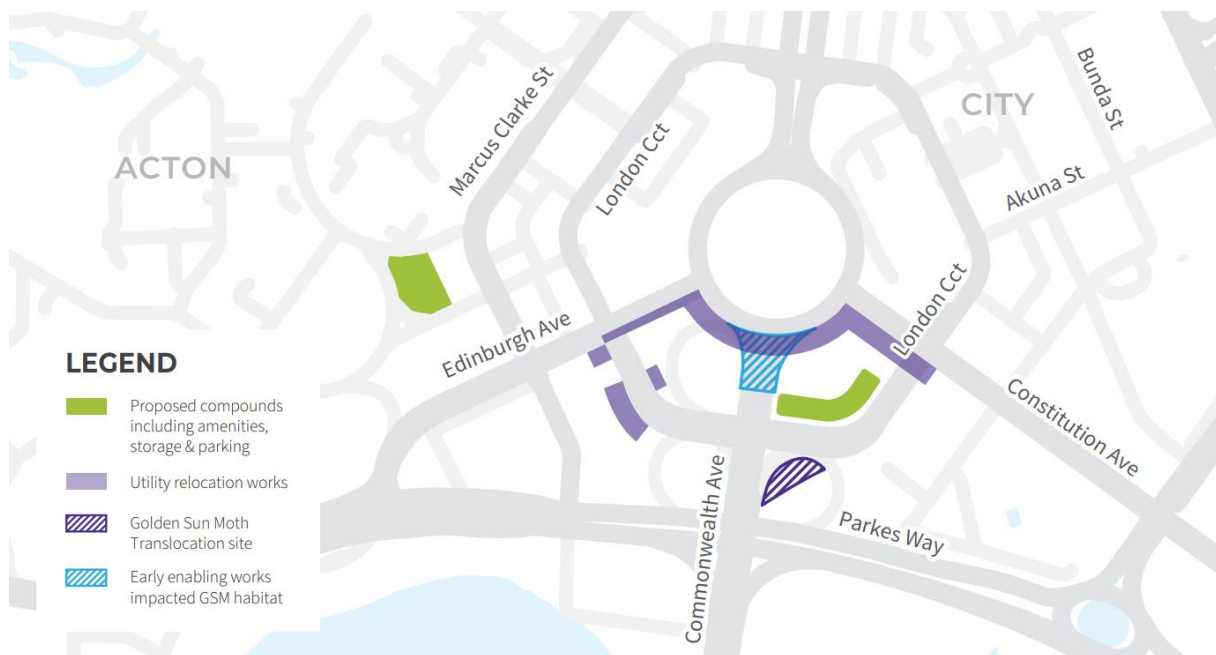


## Marcus Clarke and Gordon Street car park changes commencing October

Changes will be made to car park at the corner of Marcus Clarke and Gordon Street. A section of the car park will be used as a construction site compound. The site compound will be used for stockpiling of construction materials including surplus spoil generated. This work is to support the ongoing utility relocations and future Raising London Circuit and light rail construction work.

More than 90 car spaces including disability car spaces will remain available while these works are carried out. These changes will be in place until 2024.

The site compound will remain fenced off to ensure the safety of the public and you may see increased vehicular movements with larger vehicles entering and exiting the car park. The changes to the car park will not impact access to and from the car park and there will be pedestrian and traffic managements in place.



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## Potential additional changes to parking

Raising London Circuit will create a new at-grade intersection at London Circuit and Commonwealth Avenue. It involves gradually raising the road from ground level near the car park to Commonwealth Avenue which is 6m above the existing road and then back down to the existing road level near the QT Canberra Hotel. The design is under development and may result in temporary car park impacts throughout construction from mid-2022 and the permanent reduction of car parks once the project is complete.
