Canberra kids due for second COVID-19 vaccine dose


Children aged 5-11 will soon be due for their second COVID-19 vaccination dose.

The second dose – due eight weeks after the first dose – can be booked at an ACT Government COVID-19 vaccine clinic, GP or pharmacy.

It provides even more protection from getting very sick with COVID-19. Children who have had COVID-19 can get the vaccine as soon as they've been released from isolation and recovered.

COVID-19 booster vaccinations available

If you're aged 16+ and had a second COVID-19 vaccine dose three months ago, you are now eligible for a booster dose to increase your protection.

Even if you've had COVID-19, it is important that you still get your booster – you can do this as soon as you've been released from isolation and recovered.

Local roads get resurfaced

From Red Hill and Manuka to Campbell and Turner, road resurfacing is taking place across the Inner North and Inner South.

The work follows a record program of road repairs in the last financial year.

The lifespan of roads – and therefore when they need treatment – depends on traffic volume, traffic speed, the effects of sun over time and more.

Have your say at light rail information sessions

You are invited to help shape Canberra's biggest infrastructure project, light rail to Woden, through a series of face-to-face information sessions starting this month.

The sessions will take place across Canberra and have the light rail team on hand to share information, answer questions and gather feedback.

This will help inform the final design, reduce the impacts of construction where possible, and maximise local benefits of the light rail.



Road improvements coming soon

Three local intersections will be improved as work starts soon on installing traffic lights at:

- Dudley Street/Novar Street/Kent Street/Adelaide Avenue on-ramp
- ▶ Adelaide Avenue off-ramp/Kent Street
- ▶ Kent Street/Denison Street.

The Adelaide Avenue off-ramp to Kent Street will also be widened and new off-road paths and crossing signals installed.
