Undergoing change for the future

This is an exciting time for Canberra as we begin the process of becoming an even more connected and liveable city.

Coming soon is the set-up of site compounds to enable construction of raising London Circuit to create an at-level intersection with Commonwealth Avenue and the delivery of light rail.



Upcoming impacts to the city

Car park impacts

Selected car parks across the city will be closed or have reduced capacity with areas fenced off due to construction commencing on the raising London Circuit project.

The first to be impacted will be the City Hill car park on the corner of London Circuit and Constitution Avenue from the end of September.

An area of the car park will be fenced off and used for site offices, deliveries, amenities, storage as well as staff and machinery parking.

In early October, the car park at 41 Marcus Clarke Street will be used. Other car parks that will be used are located at the Acton Waterfront and on the corner of Edinburgh Avenue and London Circuit. More details are available at: builtforbr.act.gov.au/travel-impacts

Intersection upgrades

Prior to road closures being implemented to enable construction to raise London Circuit, the ACT Government will improve access to the city at two key locations before the end of the year.

These two locations are the Coranderrk Street/Parkes Way roundabout and the northern side of Vernon Circle.

Works will occur both day and night to install temporary traffic lights with the majority of works scheduled at night to minimise impacts to traffic.

London Circuit closures

Odgers and Verity Lanes are getting a makeover with more outdoor dining, festoon lighting, heritage tree protection, new paving, new landscaping and stormwater upgrades.

E-scooter expansion

The e-scooter hire scheme has now expanded to connect the Woden and Gungahlin regions to the city. The extension of the program into these regions provides the community with more travel options ahead of the traffic impacts associated with major infrastructure projects in the city.

A new Park and Ride at Mawson Oval will open this month providing a convenient option for southside motorists travelling to the city. Seventy-five parking spaces will be available.
