Message from the Chief Minister

The ACT Government has released updated district strategies, the new Territory Plan and new design guides, that will support more housing while retaining planning and design elements that have made Canberra one of the most liveable cities in the world.

The Government's objective is simple – more housing for Canberrans, where they want

to live. This includes proposed zoning changes to encourage a gentle increase in housing choices in existing suburbs.

Like all State and Territory governments around Australia, the ACT is using a combination of planning reforms, new suburban land release and tax reforms to increase housing supply and improve affordability.

More support for Canberra renters

The ACT Government is offering extra support measures for those who need it most. This includes the extension of the Rent Relief Fund, which provides targeted, short-term emergency support for private renters in low-income households in the ACT.

The fund offers grants for up to four weeks' rent capped at \$2,500 to help tenants and occupants maintain safe, secure and stable accommodation.

The ACT Government is also investing in a range of measures to increase the supply of affordable rentals in Canberra, with an aim to deliver 600 additional rental dwellings by 2025–26.

Mowing and road resurfacing programs underway

With the warmer weather returning, you will now see mowers out and about each day.

A fleet of 82 mowers – including four electric vehicles – will help maintain the Territory and ensure it looks its best. The rapid response team of 10 extra staff and eight additional mowers will continue to focus on higher-priority areas such as those presenting safety issues. The annual road resurfacing program is also underway to maintain the road network. Road resurfacing helps to waterproof the road, improve skid resistance and fill in cracks in the pavement.





Work begins on **new Casey park**

Construction on the new Casey Community Recreation Park is underway.

The park will offer more outdoor recreation options for all ages and abilities.

It will be equipped with new accessible toilets, barbecue and picnic areas, a multi-purpose court, play equipment and additional parking spaces.

Construction is expected to be completed in mid-2024.

Upgrades for Gungahlin College

Gungahlin College will receive upgrades to support growth in the area. Upgrades will include:

- installation of eight additional learning spaces through four relocatable learning units
- internal renovations within the college
- · rejuvenation of the existing oval
- improved use of space within the Gungahlin Library.

Plans are also underway to develop a second college in Gungahlin. Located next to the Gold Creek School senior site in Nicholls, this new college will have capacity for up to 800 students.
