#### **GUNDAROO DRIVE DUPLICATION BEGINS**

Preparatory works to duplicate Gundaroo Drive from Gungahlin Drive to Mirrabei Drive/Anthony Rolfe Avenue have begun.



The road upgrade will improve safety and relieve traffic congestion in the growing Gungahlin region. Off peak lane closures will be required, with reduced speed limits and diversion routes for cyclists.

## A NEW CLEAN AND GREEN ROAD IN NICHOLLS

An innovative approach to road resurfacing is being trialled in the ACT with recycled materials, such as printer toner, included in the final asphalt mix. As part of Roads ACT's scheduled resurfacing program. Kelleway Avenue in Nicholls was selected as the first site to receive the new asphalt product.



### THE EASTERN QUOLL RETURNS TO MULLIGANS FLAT

The Eastern Quoll is back on the Australian mainland after a 50-year absence. The small feisty meat-eating marsupial became extinct on the mainland in the middle of last century and survives in Tasmania only.

It is now being reintroduced into the 485 hectare Mulligans Flat Woodland Sanctuary where it will be surrounded by 11.5 kilometres of fox and cat-proof fencing. The translocation is part of Bringing Back Biodiversity - a joint project between the ACT Government, the Fenner School at the ANU and CSIRO.
