A new hospital for Canberra's north

The ACT Government plans to build a new northside hospital on the current Calvary Public Hospital site in Bruce, to meet the needs of a growing and ageing community.

An investment of more than \$1 billion will be included in the 2023–24 Budget to deliver the new hospital. It will provide Canberrans and the territory's healthcare workforce with access to modern, state-of-the-art facilities on both Canberra's north and southside.

The new hospital will be developed in partnership with clinicians and the community, ensuring it meets Canberra's future healthcare needs.

Canberra Theatre Centre designers announced

Early preliminary designs for the redeveloped Canberra Theatre Centre feature a bold and sophisticated façade treatment, creating a world-class venue set to attract top tier music and arts productions.

The designs formed part of the winning tender from an international architect

team made up of national firm Architectus, Danish architects Henning Larsen and global consultants Arup.

Stakeholders and the community will also have an opportunity to have their say on the project, with consultation opportunities being planned for later this year.

Raising London Circuit moves to next phase

The ACT Government is building the biggest transport infrastructure project in Canberra's history with construction ramping up on a new side track over London Circuit in preparation for the delivery of Light Rail Stage 2A. This side track will maintain two lanes in each direction on Commonwealth Avenue while the bridges over London Circuit are demolished. As this takes place, London Circuit will be raised to create a level intersection with Commonwealth Avenue.

Around 10,000m³ of fill – the equivalent of four Olympic pools – will be imported to the work site from other ACT-based project sites to build the track. Canberrans are asked to rethink their routine and be mindful of trucks when walking, cycling or driving near the area.

Traffic changes in Pialligo

A new left-hand turn from the intersection of Beltana Road and Kallaroo Road onto Pialligo Avenue will open to traffic this month.

Major roadworks will commence as part of significant upgrades to Beltana Road, which will temporarily become one-way only. The roadworks are expected to be completed in late 2023.

All businesses along Beltana and Kallaroo roads remain open and accessible during this time.

Meanwhile, major works are complete for upgrades to the Campbell shops on Blamey Street with new seating, shade structures, upgraded lighting and improved landscaping all ready for visitors to enjoy.

Upgrades coming to local schools

Ainslie Primary School, Campbell High School, Telopea Park School, Forrest Primary School, Lyneham Primary School and Majura Primary School will all receive upgrades as part of the Public School Infrastructure Renewal Program.

These works are part of the ACT Government's \$99 million investment over four years to renew and upgrade existing ACT public schools.

Energy bill relief on the way

Canberrans are set to receive much needed financial relief on their electricity bills across the 2023–24 financial year.

The ACT Government has partnered with the Commonwealth Government to provide financial relief to eligible households and small businesses through the Energy Bill Relief Fund.

The Commonwealth Government's contribution will be provided in the form of an electricity bill credit

automatically applied by energy retailers, with eligible households receiving \$175 and small businesses \$325 off their bills across the 2023–24 financial year.

The ACT Government will more than match the Commonwealth's contribution through the ACT's Large-scale Feed-in Tariff Scheme, with direct bill relief available to all electricity customers in the ACT.
