TUGGERANONG'S NEXT-GENERATION SUBURB



A new suburb could take shape between the Tuggeranong town centre and the Murrumbidgee River, breathing new life into the area and stimulating urban renewal. The I90 ha area is considered some of the best land in Canberra, along the green swathes of the river corridor with views to the Brindabellas.

The ACT Government will be investigating the area further to determine its suitability for development, ensuring that any development protects the area's high environmental and heritage values. The land is in a prime location, so residents would be no more than one and a half kilometres from the town centre. The development would also open the river corridor for more community recreation.

There's been strong demand for new property in Tuggeranong with a positive reception to the new Southquay development. We want to hear from local people about how they value the proposed development area, if it should be developed and if so, what they would like to see in the new suburb.

CELEBRATING TO DIVERSITY IN OUR SCHOOLS

Wanniassa Hills Primary
School is home to the newly
refurbished Tuggeranong
Introductory English Centre
facility. The recently extended
and refurbished school provides
a modern, first class resource
for children from a non-English
speaking background to ease into
Australian school life.

The centre accommodates 45 children and provides students with intensive English language courses in preparation for study in Canberra mainstream schools. The building is also a multifunctional space that caters to the wider Tuggeranong community, including after-hours English classes for adults.
