# Making room for the Inner North's Walk-in Centre



Work has begun on the new Inner North Walk-in Centre, with the Dickson Community Health Centre now closed for renovations.

Services will return to the revamped Dickson Community Health Centre in late 2020.

During the refurbishment, patients should check the website for their nearest community health services.

Once open, the Inner North Walk-in Centre will offer free health care for minor injuries and illnesses from 7.30am to 10pm daily. No appointment will be needed.

The ward's design was informed by suggestions from patients, their families and staff. It features a dining room for patients, families and carers as well as day beds where families and carers can stay overnight.

### Swap-and-go coffee cups take off


Several Central Canberra cafes have signed up to Green Caffeen, a free 'swap-and-go' coffee cup scheme.

Visit one of the cafes in your area that's taking part, and start swapping.

Download the Green Caffeen app, order your coffee in a reusable cup, drink it, then return your reusable cup to any participating cafe.

The next stage of the light rail network, between the city and Commonwealth Park, will feature wireless infrastructure. It will also use on-board green energy batteries and grassed tracks to maintain Canberra's iconic city views.

The extension is due to open in 2024 and will add 1.7km of track along the western side of London Circuit and onto Commonwealth Avenue, finishing at Commonwealth Park.

The following stage will connect Commonwealth Park to Woden.
