Purpose

Under section 10 of the *Period Products and Facilities (Access) Act 2023*, the ACT Government must maintain written arrangements for access to period products at public places on the Suitable Places List, available on the relevant ACT Government website. Access Arrangements set out how:

- > a person can access period products in a way that respects their dignity.
- > a reasonable range of period products will be available at the place.

Expected users

The Period Product Pilot program is targeting consumers who are experiencing unplanned need, financial hardship, from multi-cultural backgrounds, low socio-economic income backgrounds, vulnerable people and the homeless.

Access arrangements

Canberra Health Services are committed and will continue to make period products available across key clinical and public access areas to reduce and prevent period poverty.

QR Code signage will be placed in public and staff toilet facilities to indicate where free period products are available on site. Signage will be placed on bathroom doors indicating period products are available in specific bathrooms.

Range of products

Each dispenser will hold sanitary pads and tampons to expected users on Canberra Health Services sites.

Principle of Dignity

Products are available in unisex bathrooms where possible, supporting all people who menstruate to discreetly and privately access the products they need.
