

- Language education in ACT public schools – 2025 snapshot

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● Introduction

Languages are regarded and valued as one of the eight learning areas under the Australian Curriculum.

The Education Directorate is committed to strengthening language education in ACT public schools through the Language Education Action Plan. This includes providing greater access to information about language pathways.

This publication provides information about language education in ACT public schools. It outlines student participation data and identifies language learning pathways between schools.

There are 8 priority languages taught in ACT public schools: Chinese, French, German, Indonesian, Italian, Japanese, Korean and Spanish. ACT public school principals determine what languages are taught in their school in consultation with their school board and community.

ACT public schools (primary and high schools) implement the Australian Curriculum Languages learning area. Colleges deliver language programs in accordance with the ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies (BSSS) Languages Framework which may include language learning at beginning, continuing and advanced levels. In years 3 to 6, schools must provide students with a minimum of 60 minutes per week of languages education. In years 7 and 8, students must receive a minimum of 150 minutes (or one line) per week. Beyond year 8, schools offer language programs as an elective subject for students.

The languages offered in ACT public schools (including colleges) can vary from year to year, based on local community needs and interest, student demand, and the availability of qualified language teachers. Additionally, student enrolment in language programs can vary across year levels and semesters.

The following data provides a snapshot of language education in ACT public schools in 2025. Data is drawn from two sources:

- the Schools Administration System (SAS), representing students from kindergarten to year 10 who completed a language program in 2025, and
- the ACT BSSS 2025 Certification Data, representing year 11 and 12 students who completed a language education course in 2025.

Glossary

Term	Definition
BSSS (ACT Board of Senior Secondary Studies)	The statutory authority responsible for curriculum, assessment and certification of senior secondary school studies (years 11-12) in government and non-government schools in the ACT.
BSSS certification data	Official data used to report student participation and completion in language courses in years 11-12.
Completion	A student who has completed a language program and received an A-E grade recorded in SAS. In this publication, 'completion' is used instead of 'enrolment' to reflect verified participation.
Course	A defined subject of study in a language. In senior secondary education, a course consists of multiple units and may be studied as a minor (2 units) or major (4 units).
Enrolment	A student registered in a language program, course or unit. Note: Enrolment counts may differ from completions where students do not finish the program or receive a grade.
Language pathway	The sequence of language learning opportunities available to students across year levels and between schools.
Network (school network)	Geographical groupings of ACT public schools: • Belconnen • North Canberra and Gungahlin (North/Gungahlin) • South Canberra and Weston (South/Weston) • Tuggeranong
Priority languages	Languages from the Australian Curriculum that the ACT Education Directorate identifies as priority for delivery in public schools to support language teaching and learning pathways.
Program	The overall structure of language learning offered by a school, which may include multiple courses and/or units across year levels.
SAS (Schools Administration System)	The administrative data system used to record student information, including A-E grades.
Unit	A component of a course, typically studied over one semester. Multiple units combine to form a course (particularly in senior secondary education).

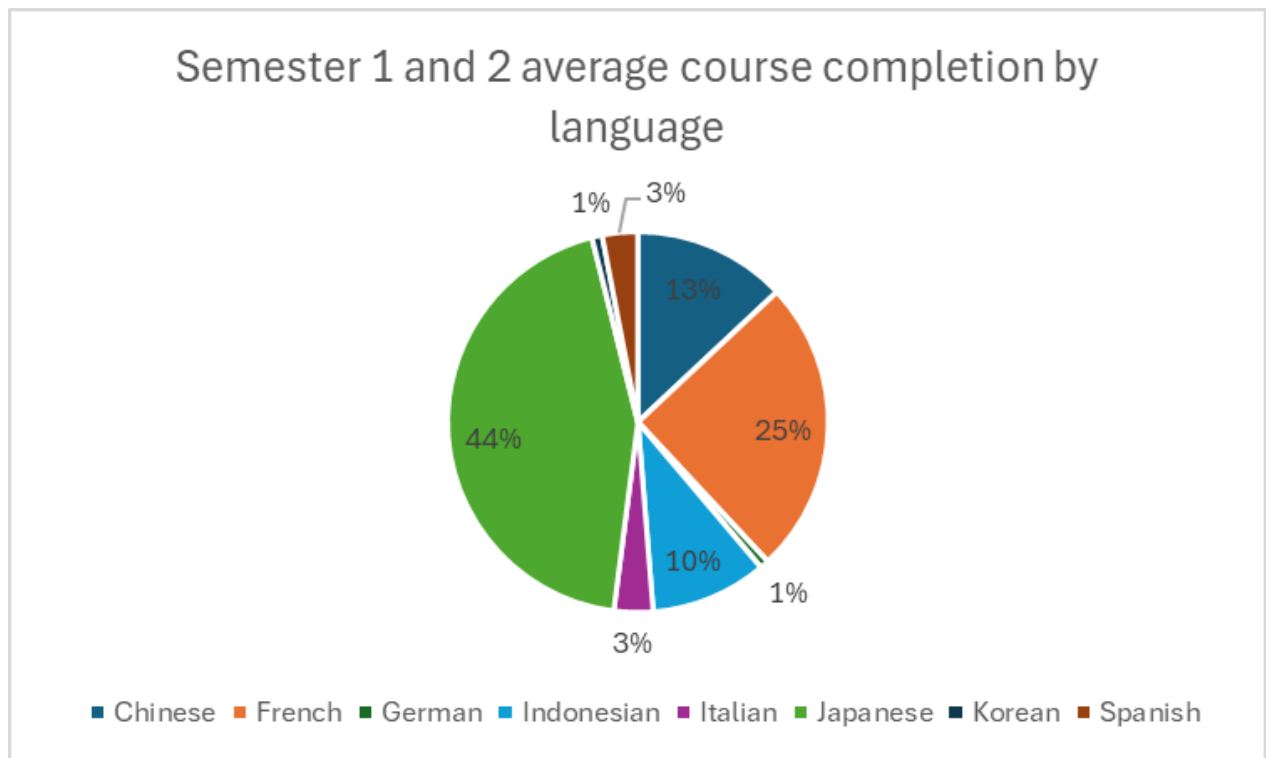
