## LIGHT RAIL STAGE TWO TO CONNECT NORTH AND SOUTH



Thanks to community feedback earlier this year, Canberrans have selected 'Woden to the City' as their preferred route for stage two of a city-wide light rail network.

Light rail to Woden will travel through some of our most iconic areas, including the Parliamentary zone, Lake Burley Griffin and State Circle. It will also create a public transport 'spine' for the city, connecting employment hubs, community services and commuters between Canberra's north and south.

Scoping and design of the second stage is now underway.

Almost 210,000 Canberrans will live, work or study within one kilometre of stage two by 2041.

## NEW STREETSCAPE AT COOLO

Your final preferred design for a new streetscape at Brierly Street and Trenerry Square in Weston Creek can be viewed in early 2017.

The first stage is set to expand the public space including a new grassy commons, new seats and bike racks, a shade element and a signage wall. Construction of stage one improvements starts mid-2017.

## NEW SECURE MENTAL HEALTH UNIT 'DHULWA' OPENS



Dhulwa, the secure mental health unit in Symonston officially commenced operations in November.

Dhulwa is the first unit of its type in our region and has capacity for 25 residents. This includes 10 acute care beds and 15 rehabilitation beds, as well as 24-hour clinical support.

Dhulwa is a Ngunnawal term meaning 'honey suckle', a native plant with healing properties.

### TRACKING CANBERRA: WODEN HERITAGE TRACK

### NEW MOLONGLO BRIDGE HONOURS EARLY CANBERRA ENGINEER

One of the longest pedestrian and cycle bridges in the southern hemisphere is now open in the Molonglo Valley. Its 242 metres long and rests on top of a 600mm diameter sewer pipe.

The bridge has been named Butters Bridge after Sir John Henry Butters, a UK-born engineer and Chief Commissioner of the Federal Capital Territory from 1925 to 1929.

Butters Bridge can be accessed from the cycling and walking trails adjacent to Coppins Crossing Road in Denman Prospect.
