



The ACT Government's plans for a state-of-the-art Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT) campus to be built alongside a new passenger-friendly bus interchange in Woden are progressing.

Feasibility studies, early-concept design development and consultation are currently underway to inform the project's business case, with project approval to be sought later this year.

This significant investment in Woden's renewal will support job creation, both during construction and once the facility is operational, as well as aid long-term economic growth in the area.

It is anticipated that 6,500 students will use the new campus each year, benefiting from a contemporary educational environment, course offerings suited to jobs of the future, and enhanced connections with local industry.

The proposed bus interchange will integrate with a future light rail terminus, encouraging active travel in the area and underpinning Woden's ongoing development as a business, transport and education centre. The project is part of the ACT Government's \$14 billion Infrastructure Plan ensuring Canberra remains one of the world's most liveable cities as its population grows.

Construction for the project is due to begin in early 2022, with the new facilities anticipated to be operational from 2024.

▲ An indicative early concept design for the new CIT Campus - Woden on Callam Street

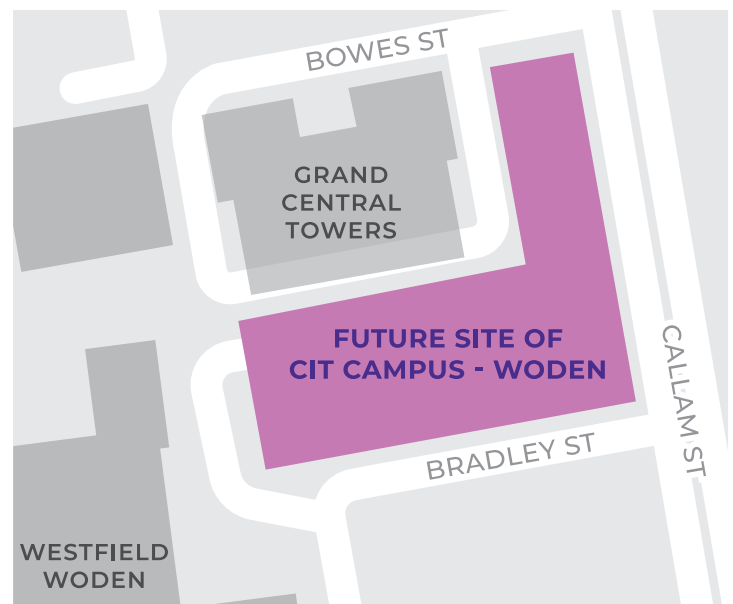
SUPPORTING WODEN'S RENEWAL

The new CIT Campus - Woden and public transport interchange will be built on the site of the existing Woden Bus Station. This central location was chosen for its convenient linkages to the Woden Town Centre.

Woden is entering a period of growth and renewal, with many private and government developments planned or underway.

The region already provides convenient access to Canberra Hospital and medical services, major retail and employment, schools and educational institutions as well as serving as a major southern interchange for commuters.

Through its renewal, Woden will become a modern urban environment where people live, work, study and move with ease.



EARLY INVESTIGATION WORKS

You may have noticed geotechnical works for the CIT Campus - Woden project occurring in the area.

In late February, Major Projects Canberra and its contractor undertook surveying work around the Woden Bus Station and Callam Street. A non-invasive ground penetrating radar was used to image below the ground to confirm utility locations and assess ground conditions. This information will feed into project planning and design for the new campus and bus interchange.

INVESTING IN VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

CIT has an impressive 90-year history providing technical and further education in the ACT and surrounding area. The Woden campus will enhance Canberra's vocational education and training network, with the contemporary and dynamic new facility complementing existing CIT campuses in Fyshwick, Bruce, Gungahlin, Tuggeranong and a continued presence in the city.

With a focus on cyber, technology, creative industries, hospitality and tourism, the new campus reflects the ACT Government's commitment to supporting all students in Canberra to reach their full potential.

It will also open up a range of new collaboration opportunities for CIT students, with local businesses, industry and the broader community.

HAVE YOUR SAY - CAMPUS DESIGN AND VALUES

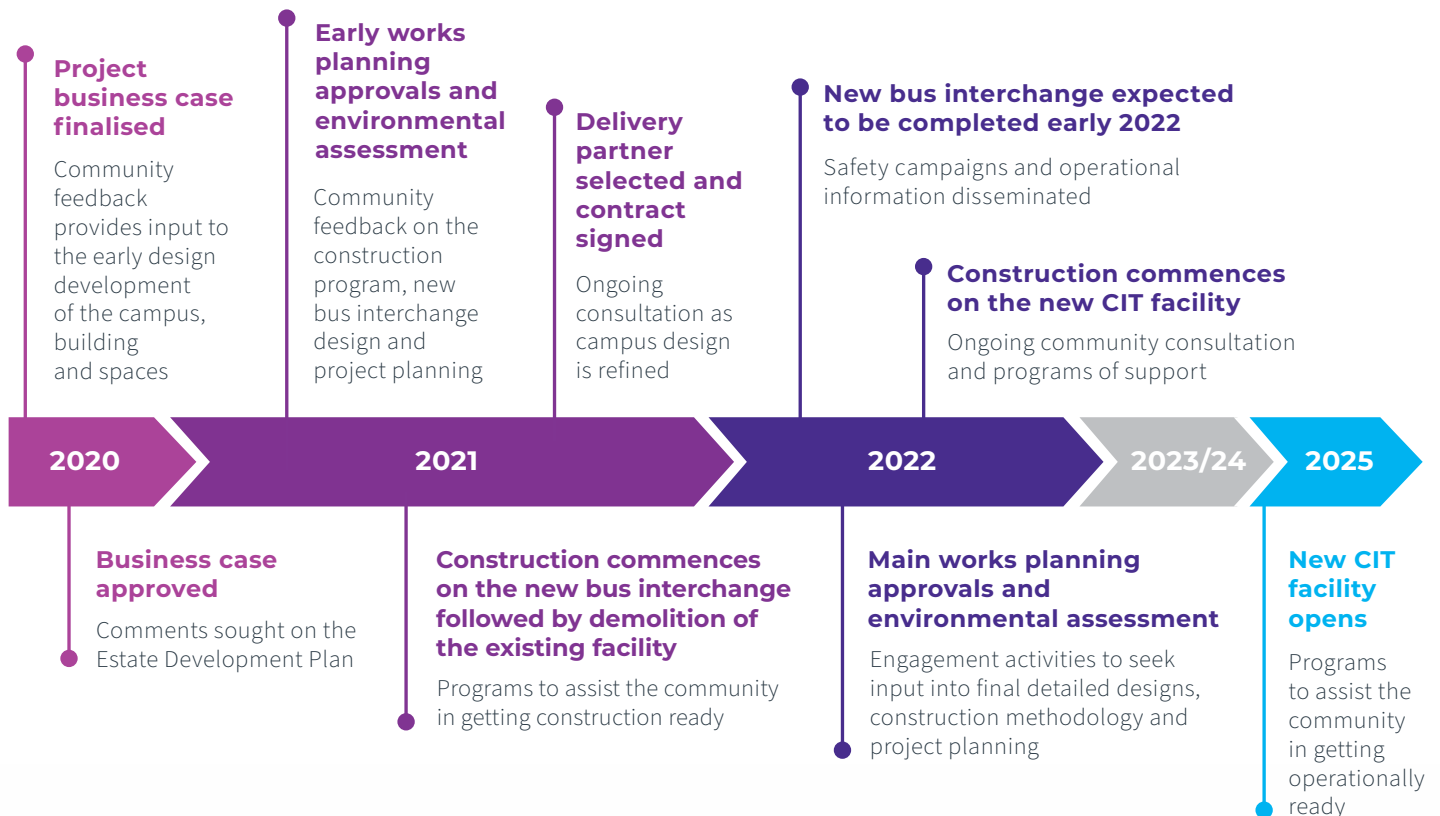
As part of the CIT Campus - Woden project development, we would like to hear your thoughts on what attributes go into the design of a great campus, building and space.
